HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Dr. A. Hope Williams is President of North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities (NCICU), the statewide office of the 36 independent (private) colleges and universities in North Carolina. As President, she is the Chief Executive Officer for the NCICU Board of Directors of college and university presidents and for the Independent College Fund of North Carolina board, which also includes corporate trustees and raises corporate and foundation funds for student scholarships and programs. She works closely with Congress and the federal government, the North Carolina General Assembly and state government, and with the North Carolina public higher education and K-12 sectors to address state education issues. She has been president of NCICU since 1992.



Dr. Williams received her undergraduate degree in French and History from Duke University, an MPA degree from North Carolina State University, and a Ph.D. in Education from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She currently chairs the boards of the Coalition for College Cost Savings and Dupont Circle Investments. She serves on the Governor's Education Cabinet, the National Advisory Board of the Institute for Emerging Issues, the NCWorks Commission, and the boards of the National Student Clearinghouse, College Foundation, Inc., Communities in Schools of North Carolina, and the North Carolina Aquarium Society.

As a Clinical Physician Executive at Novant Health, he leads initiatives to combat burnout and foster well-being among healthcare providers. He is the author of *Just One Heart: A Cardiologist's Guide to Healing, Health, and Happiness*, a bestselling guide that provides practical tools for cultivating joy, managing stress, and building meaningful connections. Inspired by his own journey through anxiety and burnout, Dr. Fisher empowers others to lead and live with compassion, resilience, and purpose.

His commitment extends globally, from co-founding the Ending Clinician Burnout Global Community to working with leaders worldwide on resilience and peak performance. Dr. Fisher's work inspires healthcare professionals, patients, and organizations to lead with compassion and courage, prioritizing well-being at every level.

The Pi Alpha Honor Society is a national society that recognizes significant academic achievement, leadership, research, community/professional service, and encourages a high standard of character and conduct among physician assistant (PA) students and graduates. These students are recognized by a turquoise- and gray-tasseled braid.

Wingate University recognizes students known to have served in the United States Armed Forces by bestowing upon them a red-, white-, and blue-tasseled braid to be worn over the gown.



COMMENCEMENT SYMBOLS AND TRADITIONS

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The formal academic dress worn today originated more than 600 years ago at Oxford and Cambridge. First a practical concession to the comfort of scholars and clerics laboring in unheated stone buildings, the apparel has changed little in appearance but has taken on a significant role in identifying the degree and alma mater of its wearer.

Gowns indicate bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. Bachelor's gowns are traditional black and are unadorned, while master's gowns have an elongated oval sleeve. The gowns of doctoral degrees are distinguished by the velvet panels on the front and the three velvet bands on the sleeves. Within the academy, only a president is entitled to wear the fourth band on the sleeve.

Hoods bear the colors of the institution from which the degree was received, and the color of the hood's border represents the academic discipline in which the degree was earned. Some examples include: white, arts and letters; scarlet, theology; dark blue, philosophy; yellow, science; pink, music; light brown, business; light blue, education; copper, economics; green, medicine; olive green, pharmacy; sage green, physical education.

Mortarboards of those with bachelor's and master's degrees carry black tassels. The gold tassel is reserved for holders of doctoral degrees.

The Wingate University Mentor Medallion, added to the academic regalia in 2018, is a two-sided pendant adorned with the University seal on one side and the Wellspring on the other. Acts 8:31, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" encircles the Wellspring. The Medallion is bestowed upon faculty, staff, and administrators who have been exemplary mentors in the areas of faith, knowledge, and service. Graduating seniors nominate their mentors for this recognition prior to each commencement.

ACADEMIC PROCESSIONAL

The academic procession is organized according to academic office and rank, in the following order: faculty marshal (mace bearer), officers of the University, professors, associate professors, assistant professors, and instructors. During the procession and recession, audience members are requested to stand, as able.

MACE

The Mace has been used in legal and religious settings for centuries. Originally used as a defensive weapon, the mace has its roots in Roman courts, where it was used to restore order. The mace eventually came to be regarded as a symbol of authority. In a University setting, it implies the authority to grant degrees and marks significant occasions on the academic calendar.

The Wingate University mace is 42 inches in length and is made of solid dark walnut with two bronze University seals. The University seal features oak leaves (representing the oak trees that populate the Academic Quad) and the phrase “Faith, Knowledge, Service” – the University motto. The mace should always lead the ceremony and procession.

GONFALONS

Gonfalons are banners that have been used since the 12th century to designate districts and to show authority. The University has adopted these symbols as a way of honoring and celebrating the uniqueness of each college and school. The gonfalons act as representations of the principles and ideals that guide the University.
