Note From The Head

In this week's newsletter, I wish to stress the importance of regular school attendance. We made some significant improvements with our attendance last year; improving our overall attendance by 2% and reducing the number of children who are persistently absent (below 90%). Our analysis this term has shown that we have regressed and a significant amount of absence relates to children being off school with unauthorised leave. The national figure for primary school attendance is 95% and our current school attendance is 91%.

When children miss learning time, gaps appear in their knowledge and skills and it impacts their progress in school. Children struggle to catch-up after an absence and it has a detrimental impact on their ability to access and enjoy their learning. Please support us by ensuring that your child is in school every day, unless illness prevents them from attending.

It is a legal requirement for children to attend school and families must be aiming for attendance to be at least 95%. As we have done for a number of years. the school will fine if the number of days unauthorised leave is above a certain threshold. Recently, we have had some parents query their fines. The fines are there as a deterrent and have been proven to improve school attendance. The school do not receive the fine and there's no financial benefit to the school. Fines (set by government) have increased this year and schools will also need to consider a fine if a child has 10

unauthorised absences in a rolling period of 10 school weeks.

Please support us with raising attendance and ensuring that regular attendance, if not already, is a priority moving forward.
