
Weekly Prayers (Psalter Week 2)

Monday 9th December



Today is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. As we will all be attending Mass today, and Fr Raymond will (hopefully!) be explaining the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception, perhaps we can begin our day with a very short, and very simple, prayer to Our Lady:

O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Amen.

('have recourse to' simply means 'turn to for help'. Note that we are asking Mary to pray for us, just as we might ask a friend, family member, priest or pastor... We don't worship Mary- we follow her example in worshipping her Son, Jesus.)

And may the peace they long for ever flower and ever reign among them.



The Response to the Psalm is: The Lord is kind and full of compassion, slow to anger, abounding in mercy.

I will give you glory, O God my king,
I will bless your name for ever.
How good is the Lord to all,

All your creatures shall thank you, O Lord, and your friends shall repeat their blessing. They shall speak of the glory of your reign and declare your might, O God, to make known to men your mighty deeds and the glorious splendour of your reign. Response:

Psalm 144 is an acrostic psalm. In the original Hebrew, each verse begins with the successive letter in the Hebrew alphabet.
