Mississippi Ag Facts of the Month

As part of Mrs. Pennington's leadership in being named "Mississippi's Ag Teacher of the Year," she and her class will share insight on our state's agriculture each month in our newspaper. You can see how much they're GROWING in Mrs. Pennington's class!







Pig in swine is a big motto of Mississippi. Pigs produce bacon, sausage, ham, and more. A pig, wild or domestic swine is a mammal of the Suidae Family. Pigs have lots of fat which is called lard. Pigs are also used to produce crayons, shaving cream, makeup products, toothpaste, plastics, and even popular snacks like Cheetos or Doritos.

Fun Fact about Crayons: Fatty acids in pig fat help keep crayons together with soybean oil.

Soybeans are one of the fastest growing crops. Seeds germinate in two days while growing in pods. One acre of soybeans produce around 83,000 crayons!

Corn is another example of agriculture Mrs. Pennington's class has studied. A typical ear of corn has about 800 kernels on it. As you can see they used some of the agriculture they've been learning about to make hands-on projects in class.
