Community:

Triton serves three suburban communities situated in Camden County. The school is located approximately six miles east of Philadelphia and 50 miles west of Atlantic City. Two of our communities, Runnemede and Bellmawr, are well established, settled areas while the third, Gloucester Township, is growing at a very fast pace.

High School:

Accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education, Triton Regional High School is a four-year public school that emphasizes college preparation. It is one of three high schools in the Black Horse Pike Regional School District. Triton Regional High School has partnered with "Believe in U" Herff Jones, where the core values are respect, recognition, rewards, and reinforcement for academic performance and good school/community citizenship. The current enrollment is approximately 1,150 students and our average class size is 25 students.

Curriculum:

Our students must earn 120 credits to meet New Jersey graduation requirements. An individual program is developed for each student and courses are offered at varying levels of difficulty. Honors, Advanced Placement and dual college credit courses are offered across discipline areas.

TRITON GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

It is the policy of the Board to provide learning opportunities and programs that are appropriate to the abilities, needs, and interests of the pupils in order that they may successfully complete an appropriate course of studies leading to graduation. The Board shall award the same high school diploma regarding the program of studies completed by the pupils. A diploma, therefore, represents only the accumulation of credits; it is not a guarantee of acceptance into schools to further one's education.

It is necessary that a student's program comply with the laws of the State of New Jersey, with the requirements established by the Board of Education, and with sound principles of education before a diploma will be granted. In order to graduate a pupil must:

- I. Pass the State Mandated Test: NJGPA New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment, or other state authorized testing pathways.
- II. Earn a total of 120 credits.
- III. Pass the following courses:
 - Physical Education each semester enrolled
 - 4 years of Health
 - 4 years of English
 - 1 year of World History/Cultures
 - 2 years of U.S. History
 - 3 years of Math
 - 3 years of Laboratory Science
 - 1 year of World Language
 - 1 year of Visual/Performing Arts
 - 1 year of 21st Century Life & Careers, or Career-Technical Education
 - Financial, Business & Economic Literacy

- V. Complete the English Research Paper requirement.
