CAV HOOPSTERS ARE "OFF THE SCHNEID"; GIRLS ALSO ROLL IN SWEEP OF CHESTER COUNTY

It's a pretty safe bet that most people don't know the origin of the sports term "schneid."

What's important today is that Crockett County's basketball Cavaliers are "off" of it.

In sports slang, to be "off the schneid" means to break a losing streak; more particularly, to get a "zero" off your record or off the scoreboard. It actually originates from the card game gin rummy, where a "Schneider" is a low point score that also boosts your opponent's score considerably higher.

"Schneider" is a German Jewish surname that means "tailor," although it literally means "cutter." How it worked its way into gin rummy is not as clear, and how "off the schneid" worked its way into the sports lexicon is even less clear.

At any rate, the Cavalier hoopsters are officially "off the schneid" after hitting some clutch free throws in the game's final two minutes to eke out a 59-54 triumph at Chester County to claim their first win after starting the season 0-3.

It was a doubly successful road trip to Henderson, as in the first game of the twin bill, Crockett's girls - despite somewhat of an "off" shooting night - hammered the Eaglettes 53-19 to move to 4-0 on the season.

The nightcap looked like it might be a nightmare for Crockett when Cade Freeman - the Cavs' leading scorer this season - was whistled (correctly) for a couple of fouls barely three minutes into the contest. He sat the remainder of the first half, but his teammates stepped up and forged a 32-26 lead at the break, sparked by a couple of threes from Jayden Frye and eight points and a boatload of inspiring hustle from DK Woods.

With Freeman back on the floor for the third period, Coach Rick Rudesill's club took its biggest edge of the game at 41-32 when Frye drilled another trey at the 3:32 mark. But less than three minutes later, the hosts had pulled it back to a 42-42 deadlock and had all the momentum swinging their way when the quarter ended at 44-all.

Chester's Jayden Williams netted the first bucket of the final period, and things seemed to be slipping away from the hard-luck Cavs once again. But that would turn out to be the Eagles' only lead for the rest of the contest as Crockett revved up its defense, exemplified by the glue-like hounding Squirt Pickens put on Chester point guard Aiden Welch, who had 16 points for the hosts – but only two in the final frame.

Pickens wasn't the only Cav putting the clamps on the Chester offense. Christian Halford – who had 15 points for the Eagles through the first three quarters – didn't score in the fourth. And when Pickens broke away for a layup with 2:19 remaining in the game, Crockett had the lead back at 54-52.

Williams scored from short range to tie it again at 54-all, but the Cavs' Zay Jones knocked down a pair of free throws with just 1:06 left to play and then deflected a Chester pass, chased down the ball, and raced it back downcourt as Rudesill's squad went into a delay game, content to move the ball around until the Eagles committed a foul. They did so with 22.1 seconds left on the clock, and Freeman calmly swished both offerings to boost Crockett's margin to 58-54.

Welch missed a long three from the left wing shortly thereafter, Freeman netted another free throw with 8.8 ticks remaining, and the Cavs celebrated their first victory of the young season when the final horn sounded.

Frye nailed four treys and led Crockett's scoring with 16 points. Freeman backed him with 12 - 10 in the second half - and Woods and Pickens each contributed eight for the winners.

Although the girls game began slowly offensively - both teams missed several shots before anyone connected - Crockett's Karlee Castellaw eventually buried a pair of three-pointers and the Lady Cavs led 9-3 on their way to a 13-5 first-quarter advantage.

Coach Kayla Irvin's team held Chester County to single digits in each of the first three periods and capped off the defensive effort by throwing a shutout at the outgunned hosts in the final frame. The Lady Cavs led 30-11 by halftime and 44-19 through three quarters.

Castellaw and Jordyn Maddox paced the Crockett offense with 12 points apiece. Amaria Walker contributed 10, point guard Gabby Bursey six, and reserve Audrey Whitby four. The Lady Cavs' shooting jitters extended to the foul line, where they made only 11 of 23 attempts.

Both Crockett teams resume the campaign Friday night at 6:00 in Trenton, where they'll head for a rematch with Peabody. The squads return home Saturday for a noon doubleheader with McNairy Central.








