The EPP Supervisor and EPP Head Administrator will continuously collaborate with representatives of the partnering district (forthgoing abbreviated as PD) to ensure all involved clinical educators (CTE mentors, EPP Instructor, school administrators) are well prepared, evaluated, and supported. The following roles have been co-selected between the KCS EPP and the PD: EPP Instructor (to facilitate all instructional components of the EPP), Mentors for EPP candidates (CTE Mentors serve as the lead in the clinical placement), Practitioners (observed at least 4x per year by EPP candidate, serve as the content based instructional experts), School/District Administrators (trained on their role in the EPP, provide ongoing support, conduct evaluation). Co-selection of clinical educators: Due to their content expertise and professional experience, the KCS EPP is managed by the EPP Supervisor, supported in curriculum delivery by the EPP Instructor. Both have a teaching background, are currently licensed/endorsed, TEAM certified, and trained by SREB on the T2L curriculum. Mentors, practitioners, and school administrators are crucial for the candidates' clinical experience. The PD has identified these parties as instructional leaders and selected mentors for their EPP candidates who fulfill formal selection criteria (per Educator Preparation Policy 5.504). The practitioners to be visited are identified with the help of the district's CTE Department staff. Preparation & Support: All stakeholders are trained and informed about their specific roles and responsibilities within this EPP system by the EPP Supervisor. All new administrators and mentors from any PD are trained in one day by SREB before the school year starts. The EPP Supervisor also supports these stakeholders throughout the program via regular on-site visits (at the candidates' schools, anticipated at least once per semester), check-ins via email, text, or phone call, and general availability for any case of troubleshooting. This shall ensure the candidates are receiving the needed support from their mentors and administrators. Collaborative approach to evaluating the clinical educators: The initial SREB training on all things related to the curriculum builds a solid foundation. Then, at the end of each school year, the KCS EPP will collect evidence of the quality of the clinical partner's work via end-of-year surveys to mentors and administrators, which contribute to measuring the effectiveness of the program as a whole. These survey results as well as other collected data will inform potential adjustments to the selection of certain practitioners and mentors. The KCS REA Department will support the EPP in helping with the analysis of the collected data. The EPP might share the results with clinical educators to identify with them certain areas of reinforcement and refinement in their mentoring activity. Also, when the EPP supervisors conduct their on-site visits as described above, they can provide immediate feedback to the mentors. EPP Supervisor, Head Administrator, and district administrators undergo annual observations by their respective supervisors and shall remain in good standing (LoE = 4 or above). In summary, all entities will regularly work together and depend on each other for fulfillment of their roles and responsibilities in the overall system (EPP program). This includes the selection, preparation, evaluation, and support of high-quality clinical educators.

Financial Agreement

When a new teacher candidate enrolls with the KCS EPP, and his/her clinical placement is in a partnering district other than Knox County Schools, special procedures regarding invoicing this candidate for his/her participation in the KCS EPP need to be followed. Since the KCS EPP is one of the few LEA-based Educator Preparation Programs in the state of Tennessee, the KCS EPP cannot directly bill a teacher candidate as an individual (like a college or university might do). KCS as a district can only invoice other districts. Those school districts then should establish a process on their end to collect the money from their teacher candidates. The following options might be considered:

- Automatically withholding \$100 from a candidate's monthly paycheck
- Invoicing the candidate for \$600 once a semester
- Potentially reimbursing a candidate the cost of the EPP (\$2,400) as an incentive measure after working for the district for a certain amount of years etc.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CAMPBELL COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION AND SPECIAL OLYMPICS TENNESSEE FOR THE UNIFIED CHAMPION SCHOOLS PROGRAM

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "Agreement") is entered into this 1st day of November 2024 through the 30th day of June 2025, by and between Special Olympics Tennessee, a Tennessee nonprofit public benefit corporation ("Special Olympics"), and, Campbell County Schools (the "School Entity"), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "parties."

The parties intend by this Agreement to implement the Special Olympics Tennessee Unified Champion Schools Program. The Unified Champion Schools Program is a Pre-K - Transition education program that unifies students with and without disabilities through Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership, and Whole-School Engagement initiatives, as defined below, which provide the participants with the knowledge, experience, and skills necessary to create and sustain school communities that promote inclusion, acceptance, and respect for all students. The Unified Champion Schools Program is conducted during the regular school day and consists of the following components:

1. Unified Sports

- a. **Special Olympics Unified Sports**: combines students with and without disabilities on sports teams for training and competition.
- b. Inclusive PE Class
- Young Athletes Program: preschool and young elementary students participate in introductions to sports and Special Olympics.
- 2. Whole-School Engagement: A youth-centered, school-focused initiative that uses the Special Olympics sports and education program to activate all students, engage educators, involve the entire school, and promote a campus culture of acceptance and social inclusion where all young people are agents of change. Examples of Whole-School Engagement include, but are not limited to, Whole School Engagement: Campaign(s) to encourage acceptance, respect, and inclusion for all students. Example: Anti Bullying Campaign, Spread the Word: Inclusion Campaign, Unified Pep Rally or Assembly, etc.

- 3. **Inclusive Youth Leadership**: Newly formed clubs or existing school clubs which plan and implement activities for Special Olympics athletes.
 - a. Unified Club: Students with and without intellectual disabilities participate together in recreational activities, fitness programs, school events, etc. Students can plan, organize and implement a Special Olympic event or activity within the school or community.

To implement the Unified Champion Schools Program, the parties agree as follows:

- 4. <u>Term.</u> The Agreement will become effective upon approval by the School Entity's governing board, and will remain in effect for one year. At the completion of the current agreement, the parties will be given the opportunity to enter a new agreement with Special Olympics Tennessee Unified Champion Schools
- 2. <u>Responsibilities of Special Olympics</u>. Special Olympics will support the Schools Partnership Program as follows:
 - a. By providing a financial grant (the "Grant") to the School Entity in the amount specified in Exhibit A to defray the costs incurred by the School Entity in implementing the Unified Champion Schools Program. Special Olympics will pay the Grant to the School Entity in two installments on or about the fifteenth day of each month, as specified in Exhibit A. No installment payment will be made by Special Olympics unless and until all prior payments made under this Agreement have been negotiated.
 - b. By providing input to assist School Entity with its selection of the Unified Champion Schools Program Liaison (the "Liaison," as defined herein in Paragraph. Final selection of the Liaison shall be made by School Entity, with such input by Special Olympics.
 - c. By providing training to the Liaison and other School Entity representatives as may be necessary for the successful implementation and operation of the Unified Champion Schools Program.

- 3. <u>Responsibilities of the School Entity</u>. The School Entity will implement the Unified Champion Schools Program as follows:
 - a. By providing the Unified Champion Schools Program for students at the sites and in the grade levels identified in Exhibit A, commencing in September, 2024 and extending through June, 2025. The Schools Partnership Program will include Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership, and Whole-School Engagement initiatives.
 - b. By selecting a teacher with a current Tennessee teaching credential, who is regularly employed by the School Entity, to serve as Coordinator. The Liaison shall promote, coordinate, and operate the Unified Champion Schools Program in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The Liaison shall utilize Special Olympics materials to recruit, train, and coordinate volunteers, teachers, and classroom aides, in order to ensure that they are prepared for their responsibilities in working with the students who participate in the Schools Partnership Program, and to satisfy all statutory and other qualification requirements.
 - c. By securing the necessary facilities for the Unified Champion Schools Program, including for both sports training and competition activities.
 - d. By involving general education students as active participants in the Unified Champion Schools Program, including as Unified Sports partners, coaches, volunteers, peers, leaders, and supporters.
 - e. By appropriately acknowledging Special Olympics and any other organizations or individuals which or who provide funding and/or other support for the Unified Champion Schools Program.
 - f. By providing program participation data to Special Olympics on a monthly basis. Such shall include, number of students participating in sports training and competition, number of students participating in Whole-School Engagement initiatives, number and type of competitions hosted, and number and type of Whole-School Engagement initiatives hosted. It will be the responsibility of the Liaison to collect and report this data to Special Olympics. Special Olympics will provide the necessary forms for data reporting.

- 4. <u>License to Use Special Olympics Marks</u>. Special Olympics hereby grants to the School Entity a non-exclusive and non-transferable license to use the Special Olympics name and logo (collectively, the "Special Olympics Marks") for the Unified Champion Schools Program promotion and operation. However, any use of the Special Olympics Marks will be subject to Special Olympics' prior approval as to usage, style, and content. The license granted under this Agreement will terminate when this Agreement terminates.
- 5. Relationship of the Parties. The Liaison and any other employee of the School Entity or any district or school included within the School Entity (collectively "School Employees") assigned to perform services under this Agreement are all School Employees, shall remain School Employees for the duration of their performance of services pursuant to this Agreement, are not and will not become Special Olympics employees at any time while this Agreement is in force, and shall not have or acquire from Special Olympics any workers' compensation coverage, employment benefit, pension, civil service or other status or right which the School Entity may confer on its employees.
 - a. The School Entity shall be responsible for the supervision and evaluation of the Liaison and any other School Employees assigned to perform services under this Agreement. The School Entity, and not Special Olympics, will maintain all legal responsibility for students and staff participating in the Schools Partnership Program.
 - b. The School Entity acknowledges that Special Olympics is a party covered by any photography and video releases executed on behalf of any School Entity students participating in any aspect of the Schools Partnership Program.

Detainee/Parental Rights and Confidentiality of Records

- 1.
