The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by President Mundy, followed Call To Order by the Pledge of Allegiance.

## Item For Consideration -

Ms. Rebecca Mundy stated that the Board of Education decided to add this special meeting the day after the July 14<sup>th</sup> meeting. She also stated that the administration had evaluated and gathered facts about the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Math program and those facts were sent to the Board of Education on July 21<sup>st</sup>. Ms. Mundy asked the Board to view their concerns regarding the offering of both a Grade 8 Math program and a Regents Algebra program with a Math lab component for Grade 8. Ms. Mundy stated that time is of the essence and staff needs to know their schedules so they can plan curriculum. Ms. Donna Guiffre stated if the Board of Education wants to make a decision on this at the August 17<sup>th</sup> Board meeting, that would be fine.

Ms. Guiffre further stated that both the Grade 8 Math program and Regents Program would be taught the same period so that if a student needed help, there would be more resources available to get that help. Ms. Ginny Gibbs will help parents decide which Math program their child is best suited for, and she will give help and support when needed.

The Board of Education had further concern about tracking and whether this would continue into high school. Ms. Donna Guiffre said there would be no tracking. The district would be providing assistance in helping the student decide which Math class they would be best suited for.

The Board of Education at their meeting of July 14 discussed bringing the Math consultant to the meeting of August 17<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Guiffre had a discussion with the consultant, who knows the caliber of program and staff, and he feels

Item For Consideration confident that the two programs can be done and is appropriate. The consultant is also available to attend the August 17<sup>th</sup> meeting if needed. A parent in the audience did state that a lot of parents were not aware of this meeting, and that their concern is real. The Board decided to bring the consultant to the meeting of August 17<sup>th</sup>.

A motion was made by Ken Lewis, Jr., seconded by Kathleen Reilly, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Board of Education hereby approves to bring the Math consultant to the Board of Education meeting of August 17, 2009. Motion carried unanimously

The Board of Education further discussed the role of the Math consultant at the August 17<sup>th</sup> board meeting. It was stated that he will be objective, address the pro's and con's, and he will be able to answer any questions the parents have regarding the 2 math classes. He will accommodate the district however we want.

After proposing the two Math 8 sections, Ms. Guiffre had a discussion with the parent who suggested bringing the Math consultant to the August 17<sup>th</sup> meeting, and she said what Ms. Guiffre proposed was fair. One Board of Education member does not want two sections and proposes keeping everyone in Math 8.

The Board of Education members present did agree to have both math classes and would like a letter to go home to those parents so that they can get some feedback to streamline the meeting of August 17<sup>th</sup>. If the administration receives negative feedback from the parents, then the Math consultant will be needed for the meeting of August 17<sup>th</sup>. It was suggested that the administration and the parents have a meeting to discuss the program with no Board of Education present. Ms. Guiffre will get started with administering the program for the upcoming school year.

A motion was made by Stephen Gessner, seconded by Mark Kanarvogel, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Board of Education hereby approves the administration to put in place, for the 2009-2010 school year, a Math 8 and an Algebra I course of study.

Motion carried unanimously

A motion was made by Ken Lewis, Jr., seconded by Thomas Graffagnino, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Board of Education voted to go into executive session at 7:40 p.m. regarding a specific personnel matter.
