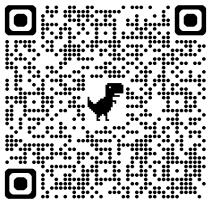

The Jenkins Memorial Scholarship for Teacher Education was created to assist outstanding students in preparing for the teaching profession. Due to Mrs. DeGrazia in Guidance no later than Wednesday, December 11th, 2024 via email: degraziaj@harrisoncsd.org.

Scholarship Amount **\$4,000 paid in installments as follows:**

- \$1,000 paid at the end of the first three academic years (usually at the end of the spring semester) after an official transcript is received confirming award compliance.
- \$1,000 paid upon receipt of official transcript stating course completion, degree completion and recommendation for teacher certification.

Eligibility- **Public High School Seniors who:**

1. Plan to prepare for a teaching career.
2. Plan to attend a college of the State University of New York for baccalaureate degree in education -OR- plan to attend a two year community college before transferring to a baccalaureate degree program in education in a college of the State University of New York.
3. Attend a high school in New York State in a school where there is a PTA/PTSA unit in good standing.

Criteria- **Character and personality, academic achievement and potential teaching ability.**

STUDENT ESSAY - "I want to be a teacher because..." Please type a statement of not more than 300 words.

Please include ALL of these items in your essay (in any order):

- The reason why you want to be a teacher
- Any related teaching, coaching, and mentoring experiences you have
- Your proudest educational achievement
- The qualities of a good teacher
- Any changes you'd like to see in education as an aspiring teacher.

If selected to move forward in this process, you will be notified via email on Thursday, December 12th and will need to complete some additional paperwork to finalize your application to be sent to the NYS PTA. Additionally, if selected to move forward by the NYS PTA you will be contacted for an in-person interview that will take place in March 2025. Please reach out to the Guidance Office with any questions.
