### A. EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Board convened into Executive Session at 6:12 pm per ORS 192.660 (2)(i) to review and evaluate the performance of the chief executive officer or any other public officer, employee or staff member, unless the person whose performance is being reviewed and evaluated requests an open hearing.

### B. REGULAR SESSION

1. **Call to Order:** The Regular Session of the Philomath School District Board of Directors was called to order by Board Chair Rick Wells at 7:08 pm on November 14, 2024 at the Philomath High School Community Conference Room located at 2054 Applegate Street. Those in attendance included Philomath School District Board of Directors Rick Wells, Joe Dealy, Sandi Hering, Erin Gudge; Superintendent Susan Halliday; and, Executive Assistant Michele McRae. Absent: Ryan Cheeke.
  - i. **Pledge of Allegiance:** Director Wells led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.
  - ii. **Approval of Consent Agenda:** Director Hering moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Director Dealy seconded the motion, and the Board approved it unanimously. Motion passes 4-0.
  - iii. **Request for Agenda Modifications:** There were no agenda modifications.
2. **Public Comment:** There were no public comments.

### C. REPORTS

1. **Student Government Report:** Raegan McKinney, the PHS ASB president, reported that since the last meeting, they held the Homecoming Dance, and it was very well attended. For Haunted Halls, they decorated the freshman and sophomore halls, and many community members and school clubs participated. They held their annual Veteran's Day Assembly last week. The VFW presented the flag and Eric Niemann spoke. Afterwards, ASB held a lunch for community members and families who served in the military. ASB held a blood drive, and they exceeded their goal.

## 2. **Association Reports**

- i. **PEA:** Nicole Stueve thanked Director Hering for attending a listening session for high school staff. She appreciates that the staff have a voice to be heard. She praised the technology team for being top notch. She added that safety is always a concern.
- ii. **OSEA:** OSEA thanked the District for the training opportunity on October 17<sup>th</sup>.

3. **Enterprise Zone Resolution Approval:** Christopher Jacobs, the economic development manager from the Corvallis Benton County Economic Development Office, explained the resolution request. Director Dealy moved to approve Resolution 2425-01 with an edit to correct a typo. Director Gudge seconded the motion, and the Board approved it unanimously. Motion passes 4-0.

4. **School Stuff:** Eric Beasley, Philomath Elementary School Principal, presented a slide show of the many fun activities that have been taking place at the elementary school. They are going to have a STEAM night this year.

## 5. **Superintendent's Report:**

- i. Superintendent Halliday announced that Philomath Middle School was named in the top 40% of Oregon middle schools for 2025 by US News & World Report.
- ii. Superintendent Halliday and Business Manager Jennifer Griffith gave a presentation to the Philomath Rotary about what has been taking place in the District, and Director Dealy and Director Gudge attended.
- iii. Parent/teacher conferences had strong attendance overall.
- iv. The Center for Educational Leadership was on site to meet with district administrators discussing ways to promote teacher efficacy. They observed various classrooms.
- v. Superintendent Halliday has been working with LBL-ESD updating language for the Local Service Plan, which supports the district in many ways.
- vi. The new telephone handsets are on site and ready for installation, and the new key card system is ready to put into place.
- vii. Surveys are almost ready to share with parents/guardians, staff and students regarding cell phones in schools.
- viii. Integrated Guidance for the 2025-2027 school year is in the beginning stages of planning.

6. **Financial Report:** The financial report was included in the Board packet. Director Wells asked if there was a particular reason why enrollment has gone down. Superintendent Halliday answered that there isn't one main reason.

7. **City Council/School Board Meet & Greet:** Directors Gudge and Hering met at Timber Towne Coffee with some of the city council members on a Saturday to meet with interested citizens.

## D. **STRATEGY AND DISCUSSION**

1. **OSBA Follow Up:** Superintendent Halliday said that work session outcomes were received from Vince Adams, and she asked the Board when they wanted to meet to follow

up with Board goals. They decided to schedule a work session within the first few weeks of January, and the meeting date will be decided via email.

2. **District Improvement Plan/Strategic Plan Updates:** Superintendent Halliday shared information from the District's last improvement plan. She said that she wants to get survey information out to families to see what their priorities are for their students as they're working towards a strategic plan.
3. **Safety and Security Updates:** Superintendent Halliday reported that she has spoken with Joey DiGiovannangelo and Jennifer Griffith about dividing the safety committee into two groups: one for facilities and infrastructure and one for individual and/or system threats. The two independent groups will meet a few times a year to work together.
4. **Clemens Community Pool Usage Agreements:** Eugenia Moone, the Clemens Pool Supervisor, spoke about pool usage by groups in Corvallis because of the Osborne Aquatics Center shut down. She answered questions from the Board.
5. **Integrated Guidance:** Superintendent Halliday shared the Integrated Guidance Annual Report Narrative for 2023-2024. She explained the details in the section about success and she celebrated the Academy for their high completion rate for students on a 5-year path. She also celebrated literacy gains for 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students thanks to RTIi supports.

#### E. DISCUSSION & ACTION ITEMS

1. **PSD/KVCS Joint Board Meeting:** The date decided on for the Joint Board Meeting between PSD and KVCS is January 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:00 pm at King's Valley Charter School.
2. **OSBA Elections:** The Board decided to vote on the candidates and the three resolutions at the next Regular Board Meeting. Clyde Rood, the candidate for Division 10 spoke about his goals.
3. **December Regular Board Meeting Date/Time:** The Regular Board Meeting for December was moved to December 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### F. MEETING CLOSURE

1. **Next Meeting Agenda Items:** OSBA Elections, status report on Safety Committee, Board member's school liaison and committee assignments, work session.
2. **Board Thanks:** Director Gudge thanked Eric Beasley and all of the elementary school employees for creating a culture and environment of safety and belonging for their school. She also thanked Eugenia Moone for making the pool available to our neighboring school district. She thanked the other Board members for attending OSBA's Legislative Roadshow in Albany. Director Hering thanked the District for honoring our Veterans. She said that she didn't realize that other districts do not have Veteran's Day assemblies and it makes her feel proud that Philomath School District is honoring our Veterans. Director Wells was also grateful for the Veteran's Day Assemblies. He thanked everyone in the District for giving 110%.
3. **Board Requests:** Director Wells said that he would like to see our CTE program expanded in the District.

4. **Adjournment:** Board Chair Rick Wells adjourned the meeting at 9:38 pm.

### Resolutions

- To Amend Oregon School Boards Association's Bylaws Relating to Composition of the Board of Directors (Creates the Oregon School Board Members PRIDE Caucus)
  - Mission: To promote quality education for all students with an emphasis on the unique needs of LGBTQIA2S+ students, staff and board members.
  - Goals:
    - The implementation of ODE's "Oregon LGBTQ2SIA+ Student Success Plan."
    - Promoting positive and effective relationships among LGBTQIA2S+ school board members, their communities, political leaders, partner organizations and OSBA.
    - Building and increasing capacity of LGBTQIA2S+ school board members.
    - Serving as a resource.
    - Developing, promoting, and advancing legislation to improve educational opportunities and outcomes for LGBTQIA2S+ students, staff and families.
    - Equipping and advancing LGBTQIA2S+ board members to serve in the general OSBA leadership.
    - Building capacity of the general board membership in understanding the issues of LGBTQIA2S+ people and inclusion.
  - The proposed Bylaws will be submitted to the membership for consideration during the 2024 OSBA election by resolution.
- To Amend the OSBA Dues Schedule
  - Proposal to increase dues 15% per year for five years, then have an annual increase tied to CPI every year thereafter, with a \$1,500 floor and a \$25,000 cap. This increase will roughly double annual dues revenue to just over \$1.3 million by the end of year five.
  - The proposed Dues Schedule will be submitted to the membership for consideration during the 2024 OSBA election by resolution.
- To Amend the OSBA 2023 Bylaws
  - Allowing caucuses to have an additional director on the OSBA board of directors in the circumstance where the OSBA president or immediate president is a director from a caucus. This revision is intended to provide the same opportunity for representation for caucuses as is currently provided to regionally elected directors.
  - Clarify that OSBA board of directors must comply with the Oregon government ethics laws with respect to conflicts-of-interest.
  - Require OSBA caucuses to submit an annual year end fiscal report to the OSBA board of directors.
  - Create officer eligibility criteria that requires candidates for officer positions and directors in officer positions to be voting members of the OSBA board of directors.
  - Expand the OSBA board of directors and legislative policy committee with representatives from the Oregon school board members PRIDE caucus.
  - Edits to grammar, punctuation, and language for readability.
  - The proposed Bylaws will be submitted to the membership for consideration during the 2024 OSBA election by resolution.

Board Members:

Philomath enrollment is currently 1622 including part-time students.

ODE will not be recalculating the 2024/25 State School Fund (SSF) estimates until 2<sup>nd</sup> period ADM reporting is completed. We will not have a new SSF estimate until February 2025. We anticipate that for our district the new estimates will be based on the extended ADMw, which will go back to last year's numbers. This could result in approximately \$200,000-\$250,000 reduction in SSF for 2024/25. We will update the Board with updated numbers when a new estimate is available.

We received draft audit documents from the Auditors. We are reviewing the documents now and will have final documents to present at the January board meeting.

A draft 2025-26 Budget preparation calendar will be shared with the Budget Committee this month. After reviewing the calendar it will be presented to the board for adoption at the January Board meeting. The first budget information session will be scheduled for early February.

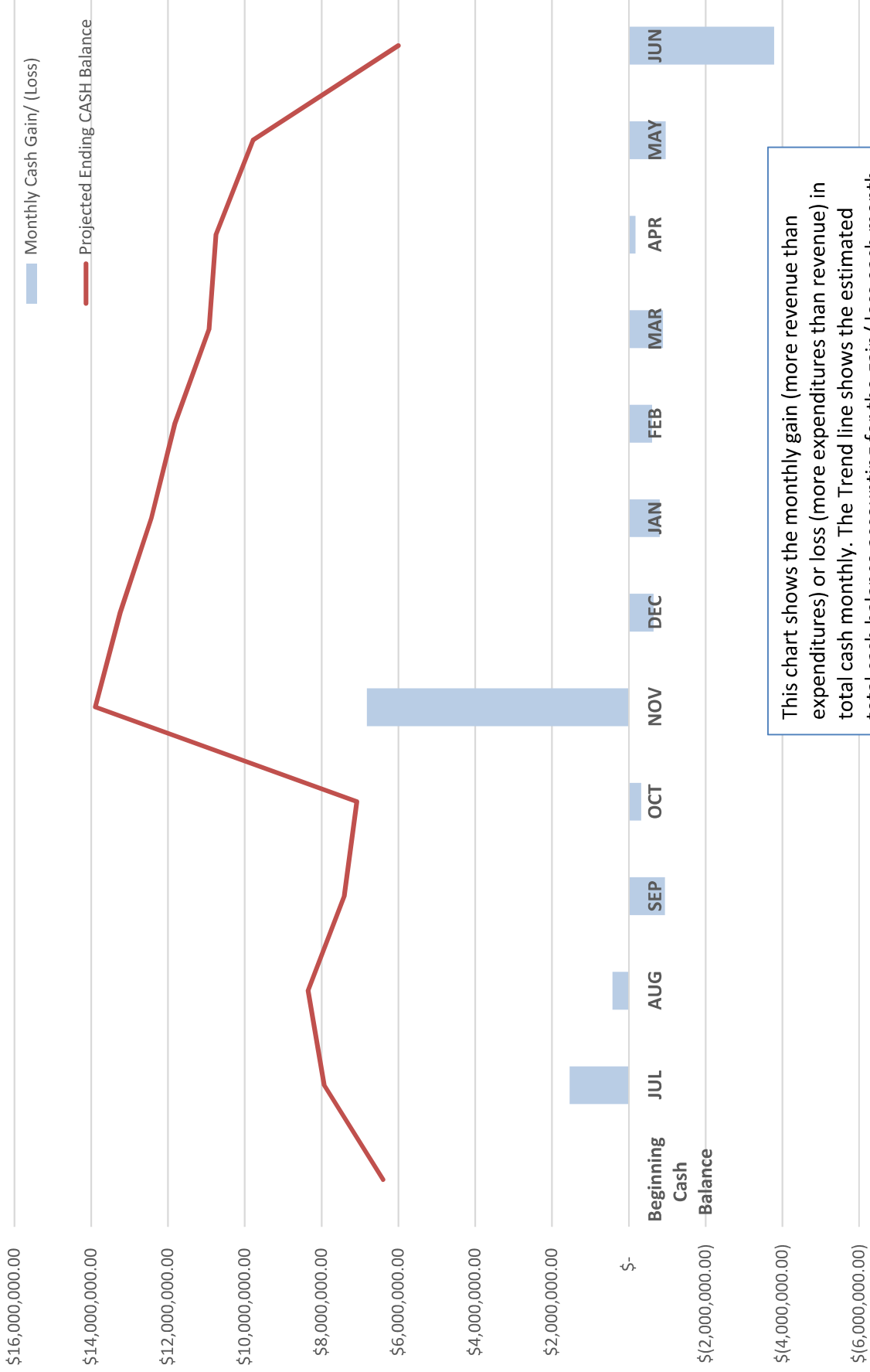
