Barnstable is accredited by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Calendar year runs September – June. Student are scheduled for seven classes with four marking periods.

#### Course Placement Philosophy

A core value at BHS is that all students are appropriately challenged and supported both in terms of the work in individual classes and more broadly across a student's schedule. As students consider their course load, we support them in finding an appropriate level of stretch and balance within their classes.

#### **Dual Enrollment**

BHS offers dual enrollment courses in partnership with local colleges and universities, providing students with the opportunity to earn both high school and college credit credits simultaneously. Each dual enrollment course completed with a passing grade is awarded high school credit. A three credit college course is equivalent to one high school credit. The Dual Enrollment courses are weighted at the same academic level as AP.

## Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

BHS offers an extensive selection of 26 Advanced Placement (AP) courses across various disciplines. To receive the AP designation on their transcript, students are required to complete the corresponding AP exam. Students can enroll in an AP course as early as the 9th grade, if they meet the necessary prerequisites.

#### Seal of Biliteracy

The State Seal of Biliteracy is an award provided by state approved districts that recognizes high school graduates who attain high functional and academic levels of proficiency in English and a world language in recognition of having studied and attained proficiency in two or more languages by high school graduation.
