All students in grades 9-11 are required to take first semester exams. Students may not reschedule exams simply because they do not want to attend school on December 18th-20th. All exams will be administered on the scheduled exam day.

Because of their senior project requirement, first and second semester exams will be optional for all seniors. A senior may choose to take an exam if s/he feels it could help to raise her/his semester grade.

High school students who are taking an AP class are required to report to her/his AP class during their regularly scheduled AP block unless other directions have been given by the teacher. If a student receives an Unexcused Absence for a missed AP exam block, she/he earns a zero for all missed work that day.

Middle school students are ONLY taking exams for high school credit classes. This includes PreAP English I, PreAP Algebra I, PreAP Geometry & Statistics, and Spanish I/Mandarin I. However, middle school teachers will be using their exam period to administer an end of unit test, have students give a presentation, or complete instruction prior to break.

## From the Sports Desk

**Varsity Boys Basketball** experienced a tale of two halves Wednesday night on the Island as the Golden Warriors roared into halftime after a dominant second quarter leading HH Prep 32-21. The halftime break gave the Dolphins a chance to regroup, and the visitors could not muster the same intensity or execution in the second half and saw their lead erased by the beginning of the 4th quarter. Four more 3-pointers in the final frame put the game away for HHP with a final score of 58-42. JP2's record is now 4-1 and will compete next against May River HS next Tuesday on the road.

On Monday, the Boys' Varsity overcame a sluggish start with some sharpshooting from junior Logan Cotter, who connected on 4 of 5 field goal attempts and finished the evening with 12 points. Co-captain Nicholai Atkinson ultimately led the way with 16 points, but the defense was the story all night as the Cross Stingrays could only manage 18 points to JP2's 73. The Golden Warriors record improved to 4-0.

**JV Boys Basketball** traveled to Hilton Head Prep to battle for the second time in two weeks. The Warriors came out strong and finished with a dominating 40-19 victory. Leading the way was 8th grader Jadon Inabinett with a career-high 12 points off the bench. Sophomore Deuce Kerschbaum chipped in with 10 points, while Leiland Fripp controlled both ends of the court and finished with 9 points. All 11 players contributed to the game, with seven getting into the scoring column. The Warriors return to action at home on Saturday vs Battery Creek at 12 pm.

**Middle School Boys Basketball** won Monday Night versus the Low Country Montessori School 60 to 11. Jackson Probst led the team with 10 points. The entire team scored at least one basket. Everyone had a great time, and we look forward to competing versus Hilton Head Christian at St Francis.

Dominique Jones played amazing defense, scored 8 points, and had 3 assists. Lauren Majorkiewicz was a great floor general with 10 points, 4 assists, and 5 rebounds. Great team basketball!

On Monday night, offensive struggles and early foul trouble led to a loss against Cross, 51-42. Lily Termini fought hard for her 13 points and 11 boards which lead the team. Lauren Majorkiewicz scored 10 points, and Dominique Jones added 9. Evelyn Melnick once again played great defense.
