## Track & Field Team Breaks Records and Shines at State

The Track & Field team had an incredible season, highlighted by Isabel Evans winning State in the

100m hurdles and placing second in the 300m hurdles. Ava Travis finished 12th in the State in the 400m dash, and the 4x800 relay team set a new school record.



## Middle and High School Music Program Success

Led by alum Mr. Alex Healey, the grades 6-12 music program has soared from 50 to 150 students and now features middle school, concert, jazz, and

marching bands. Last spring, the high school concert band made history, earning a Superior rating at the OMEA contest.



# FINANCES

#### Britt Lewis, Treasurer/CFO

The role of the Treasurer/CFO is to manage receipts and investments, strictly adhere to legal and school board policies, and ensure responsible stewardship of taxpayer dollars. We closed 2023-2024 school year with a General Fund balance of \$7,864,318 and expect the balance to be \$8,122,767 at the end of the 2024-2025 school year.

In fiscal year 2024, local taxes and collections formed about 59.5% of our General Fund revenue, with state subsidies making up the rest.

This insight is vital for crafting a budget that meets our students' educational needs, maintains our facilities and grounds, and responsibly uses public funds.

# Middle School Plumbing

The district completed a major plumbing project at the middle school, requiring the school to close over the summer. The \$500,000 project included updated plumbing, new fixtures, and partitions in all boys' and girls' bathrooms and locker rooms—an essential upgrade to extend the life of the building.

# New Athletic Complex Opens at Northridge

In August 2024, Northridge Local Schools proudly opened its new state-of-the-art athletic complex, completed on time and on budget. The facility, featuring an 8-lane track and new field, will serve our sports teams, band, and students all year long and is a space for the entire community to enjoy. The \$8 million project, funded through creative financing and generous community support, reflects our commitment to fiscal responsibility and minimizing taxpayer impact.
