

Piper USD 203 was the only school district in the state of Kansas to earn the Kansans Can Individual Plan of Study GOLD STAR for offering quality and inclusive opportunities for ALL students to experience connected learning which develops academic knowledge, as well as technical and employability skills.


Piper cultivates a culture of career exploration and planning from elementary school onward, recognizing the importance of early exposure to diverse career paths.



At the elementary level, Piper focuses on INSPIRING students with interactive career awareness activities and #FUTUREREADY projects. Each of these awareness activities includes our Portrait of a Piper Graduate Competencies and direct connections to industry partners.



At the middle school level, Piper IGNITES students' individual passions and begins linking those directly to careers of interest. The Academy exploration courses help students deepen their understanding of the workforce and culminates in students electing an Academy which provides a lens to direct their studies at the High School.



At the high school level, the students IMMERSE in their chosen career pathway, and explore the various sectors within each discipline. The experience culminates in a yearlong capstone course that allows students to showcase their work and create industry-specific experiences that reflect their unique learning.

SENIOR CAPSTONE PROJECT

As a part of the Piper School District Graduation requirements, each senior participates in a Capstone Experience. This experience provides each individual senior the opportunity to be immersed in real world learning and to stand before their business partners, mentors, educators, community leaders, and peers to showcase their achievements in a culminating presentation. This showcase not only indicates the employability and technical skills learned in the capstone experience, but also the Portrait of a Piper Graduate Competencies and Market Value Assets achieved.

The Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation produced a video hilighting Piper's Wall-to-Wall Academies and Senior Capstone Project.









The success of the wall-to-wall academies has caught the attention of education organizations and school districts from across the country. In fact, several superintendents from varying states have requested to participate in the senior capstone presentation experience to gather insight and model Piper's program at their respective districts. Members of the Kansas legislature and Kansas State Department of Education have also requested a seat at the table to participate in the student presentations.

Piper's award winning staff has also been recognized for their work in Real World Learning initiatives, and implementing the wall-to-wall academies. In 2024, the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation named Piper's Polly Vader as one of the Real World Learning Coordinators of the Year.

Other recent awards tied to Piper's success include Tim Leffert, Piper Middle School Principal, being named as the Kansas Principals Association (KPA) Area 1 Middle School Principal of the Year and Dr. Jessica Dain, Superintendent of Piper USD 203, being named by the National School Public Relations Association (NSPRA) as a Superintendent to Watch in 2023.





This honor is given to a select number of schools across the U.S. for providing broad access to transformative learning experiences for students through PLTW STEM curriculum. PLTW is a national nonprofit organization that serves millions of PreK-12 students and teachers in schools across the U.S., aiming to make every child in every grade STEM successful. The PLTW Distinguished School recognition honors schools committed to increasing student access, engagement, and achievement in their PLTW programs. To be eligible for the designation, Piper had to have more than 75 percent of the student body participating in the program and had

to offer at least one PLTW Launch module at each grade level during the 2022-23 school year.
