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WHAT IS TITLE I?

- Is the largest federal assistance program for schools.
 - Provides support to students who are at risk of not meeting the State's academic standards.
 - Determines funding by the number of students receiving free or reduced lunch.
 - Supports parents/families by offering activities and training opportunities to increase engagement in their children's education.
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WHAT IS TITLE I?

Two types of Title I programs:

- Targeted Assistance:
 - No schools in GCPS participate in TA
- Schoolwide:
 - 78 schools participate in GCPS



WHAT ARE OUR SCHOOL GOALS?

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WHAT TESTS WILL OUR STUDENTS TAKE THIS YEAR?

- National, State, GCPS, and Local School Tests
- 9th graders: MAP (August and January)
- 10th graders: PSAT (October)
- 11th graders: SAT (March)
- ACCESS for MLs (January)
- EOCs for Biology, Algebra I, US History, and 11th LA (end of April/beginning of May)
- AP Test (May 5-16)
- Final exams in December and May

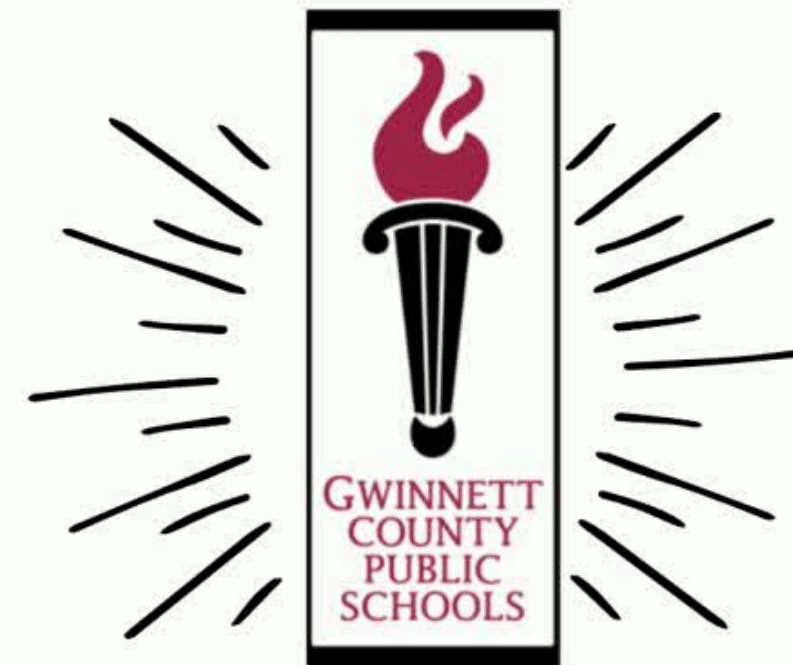

 - Make sure you are on MyPaymentsPlus
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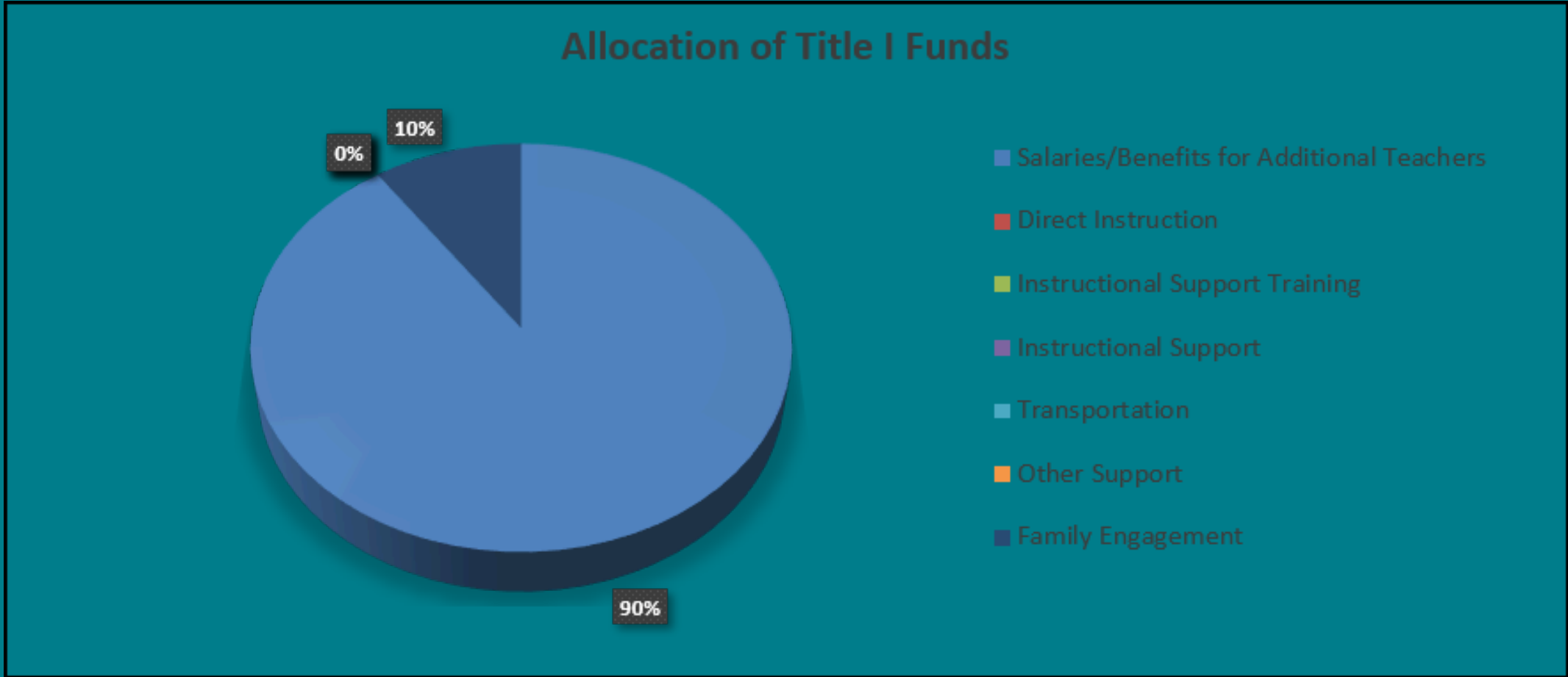
HOW WILL GCPS USE TITLE I FUNDS?

- 1% of the GCPS Title I budget supports family engagement and is divided among Title I schools based on the number of students who qualify for free/reduced meals.
 - These funds are used to partially pay for a parent support person and/or to fund family engagement activities at schools.
