Dual Enrollment vs AP



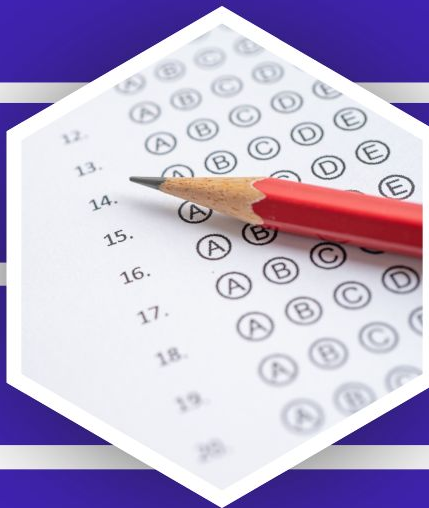
Dual Enrollment

Earning College Credits: College credits are automatically earned by passing college courses.

Academic Rigor: College-level rigor and skills are taught in the class.

Cost: Often tuition-free or highly discounted compared to normal college tuition rates. Many of the courses are offered free to high school students under TOPS.

GPA: Your grade appears on both high school & college transcripts, affecting cumulative GPAs. Students can enter college with a high GPA.



Advanced Placement



Earning College Credits: You only earn college credits by scoring three or higher on AP exams.

Academic Rigor: College-level rigor and skills are taught in the class.

Cost: It requires an exam fee, but the courses are free.

GPA: Grade in the class impacts high school GPA, but scores on AP exams do not.
