




# Gym Space Constraints at SHS

### **Usage Details**

- Adult Education Swim:
  - Monday and Tuesday are adult learn to swim,
  - Wednesday is Water Aerobics,
  - Thursday is Adult Lap Swimming.
- Stingrays
  - Stingrays can accommodate about 150 students (ages 6-16)
  - Typically, 280-300 kids try out and only half are accommodated.
- Learn to Swim
  - Weekend session usually has anywhere from 140-160 a session.
  - Summer Learn to Swim usually has about 200+ each session (3 sessions).
    - First session this year (weeks 1 and 2) we had 210 students.
    - Second session (weeks 3 and 4) we had 240 including 20 preschoolers, and
    - the third session (weeks 5 and 6) we had 220 including 10 preschoolers.

# More Explanations

#### AVI Process

- NYSED required Syosset to complete an AVI in 2020 and 2022 with a Building Conditions Survey in 2023. The 2022 AVI inspections identified infrastructure and systems that are nearing their end of useful life to create a 5-year plan.
- Last fall, the BOE reviewed the inspection report and prioritized this scope of work (\$80+ million), narrowing to essentials (\$49 million).


#### Approval Process

- BOE Approval
- Voter Approval
- NYSED Approval (building permit)
- Competitive Bidding/Contractor Award
  - Verify Bonds and Insurances
- Construction begins

#### Construction Process

- Designs developed by architect (H2M)
- Approved by NYSED (building permit)
- Contractors Overseen by Construction Manager (Elite)
- Different bidding process for each project (multiple prime contractors)
- Projects started on rolling basis.
- Will last several years.
- Where construction occurs during the school year, safety fences and other procedures keep students/staff safe
- Prefer to do dusty work in summer, use hoses to wet ground to suppress dust
