Woodbury School Potential Uses

- Cost range up to \$15 million.
 - Depends on usage and unknowns.
 - Will likely be required to conform to Historic Preservation requirements
- Based on existing site conditions, the basement cannot accommodate ceiling heights greater than 7'-10".
 - Per NYSED regulations, all classroom spaces require a minimum 9'-0" ceiling height.
- At most, the building could house 2 UPK-sized classrooms.
 - This would limit the number of Business office staff that could be relocated to about 20.
- Options
 - Hybrid house 2 UPK classrooms and 20 business office staff
 - "E" Occupancy \$15 million
 - Office Only house 31 business office staff
 - "B" Occupancy \$12.9 million
 - Maintain "community room" in either scenario



HBT Site Plan (Conceptual)





Berry Hill Portable Replacement (Conceptual)

 - = \$26.3 million







Traditional vs. Pre-manufactured Construction


Traditional Masonry Construction


- Typical masonry construction materials:
 - CMU block (cinder block)
 - masonry veneer
- Site prep/work is performed prior to construction
- Timeline
 - +/- 1 year to prep site and
 - +/- 1-year traditional masonry construction
 - 2-year construction schedule.
- Masonry construction is considered permanent
 - 50-100 year Expected Service Life ESL


Pre-manufactured Construction

- Materials:
 - Modular units to be built as rigid steel frames with moment connections (very stiff connections)
 - Wall infill to be metal stud construction.
 - Exterior finishes to be 4" masonry veneer.
- Units are constructed offsite within a controlled environment and shipped to site.
- Site prep/work is performed concurrent with modular units. (+/-1 year to prep site; simultaneously +/- 1-year traditional masonry construction) = 1-year construction schedule.
- Type IIB construction is considered permanent (typical type IIB construction is steel frame (post and beam) with Metal stud infill and masonry construction, 50-100 year ESL)
