

Federal Grant Acts and Associated Funds



EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA)

- •ESSA is a federal educational law that outlines and specifies how states and schools can use federal grant money to support school district programs and students in need. ESSA emphasizes **equity** in education for <u>all</u> students and expands measures for school accountability and student success.
- •ESSA Programs encourage collaborative decision making, with the District's various constituency groups, to direct the allocated funding towards meeting the needs of all students, parents, families, teachers, and schools.

<u>COVID-19 Relief Funds</u>

The Federal Government and the State Government have made grant funding available to support our schools during the COVID-19 crisis.

The Federal Government has provided schools with <u>The Elementary and</u> <u>Secondary School Emergency Relief Funds</u> (ESSER) and <u>The American</u> <u>Rescue Plan Funds</u> (ARP).

Additional federal funding was also provided directly to NYS to support schools through the <u>Governor's Emergency Education Relief Funds</u> (GEER).

Coronavirus Aid, Relief, & Economic Security Act, 2020 (CARES Act) ESSER I & GEER Funds

- **ESSER I** funds were allowed to be used for any activities authorized by the Every Student Succeeds Act of (ESSA).
- **GEER** funds were meant to provide flexible education relief to support schools "most significantly impacted by coronavirus" in their efforts to continue providing educational services to their students; to provide for the "on-going functionality" of these entities; and to cover a broad range of activities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in order to effectively maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff.

2020 (CARES Act) ESSER I & GEER Funds

ESSER I

(Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Funds):

\$189,969 (\$5,427.69 x 35 low-income students)

Use of ESSER I Funds: To support the purchase of educational technology for students, to support educational interaction between all students and classroom instructors.

\$19,924 MakeMusic, Inc. (partial cost)

\$170,045 Purchased through BOCES Technology Services:

- EdPuzzle
- Learning A-Z
- MyOn Reader
- IXL Learning-Math

GEER

(Governor's Emergency Education Relief Funds): \$32,196 (\$919.89 x 35 low-income students)

Use of GEER I Funds:

To provide additional social and emotional support for all students through our Guidance and Counseling Services and additional BOCES services.

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSA) ESSER II \$663,984

- The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA) provided a second round of elementary and secondary emergency relief funds known as ESSER II.
- Allocations were calculated in the same manner as ESSA Title I, Part A Funds.
- Allowable uses of funds include projects to improve air quality in school buildings.
 - The Dedicated Outdoor Air System/DOAS installation at South Woods MS
 - \$663,984 (partial cost)

American Rescue Plan Act, 2021 (ARP Act) ARP ESSER Funds \$1,491,213

- The American Rescue Plan Act (ARP ESSER) made available a third round of elementary and secondary emergency relief funds.
- This funding may be used to address student learning loss, the social, emotional, and academic needs of students, the purchasing of instructional technology, and projects to improve the indoor air quality in school buildings.
