Who We Are



- Over the years school demographics gradually changed.
- Last three years a substantial increase in non-English speaking as well as culturally diverse families have moved in.
- Syosset Council of PTAs saw a need and worked successfully to fulfill that need.









Buddy Program

New parents from different cultural backgrounds are assigned a "Buddy" to help answer questions regarding school, PTA and class activities and translate when needed.

- Launched in Baylis Elementary School in 2005.
- Each unit manages their own Buddy Program and solicits volunteer translators.
- Flyers are translated into multiple languages are included in registration packets (available at the registrar's office) and are also distributed through the unit PTAs.
 - Languages offered include Chinese, Korean, Japanese, Hindi, Urdu, Czech, Spanish and Slovak.
- We work closely with ENL teachers, guidance counselors and principals to identify families who may require a buddy.







Cultural Unity Committee

District-wide initiative created by Syosset Council of PTAs

- Launched in 2015 as a result of the success of the Buddy Program.
- Each unit has a representative that sits on this committee and organizes district-wide events in addition to events in his/her school.



Eg: Cultural Unity Roundtables are hosted twice a year in the SHS Student Lobby.





Some Results

- Buddy Program participation has increased by 40%.
- Parents from culturally diverse backgrounds are now taking on roles as Council Delegates, Committee Chairs and Officers in their units and on Council.
- Third district in Long Island to have Lunar New Year approved as a school holiday in 2016.
- First district in Long Island to have Diwali and Eid approved as school holidays in 2017.
- District hired translators to help parents during Parent-Teacher Conferences and other faculty/administration meetings.
- District launched an automated phone and email system that sends out important messages in the language of preference.
 Eg: school closings and student safety alerts.
