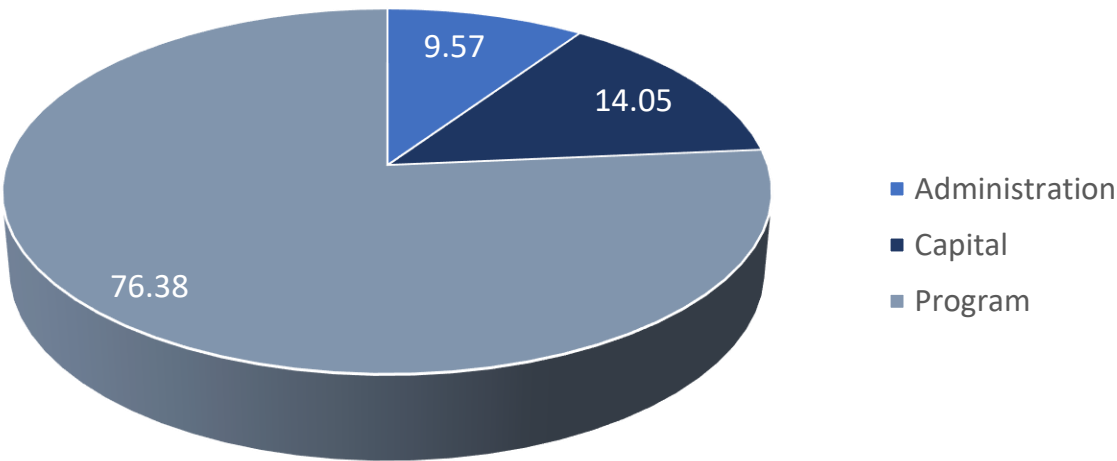

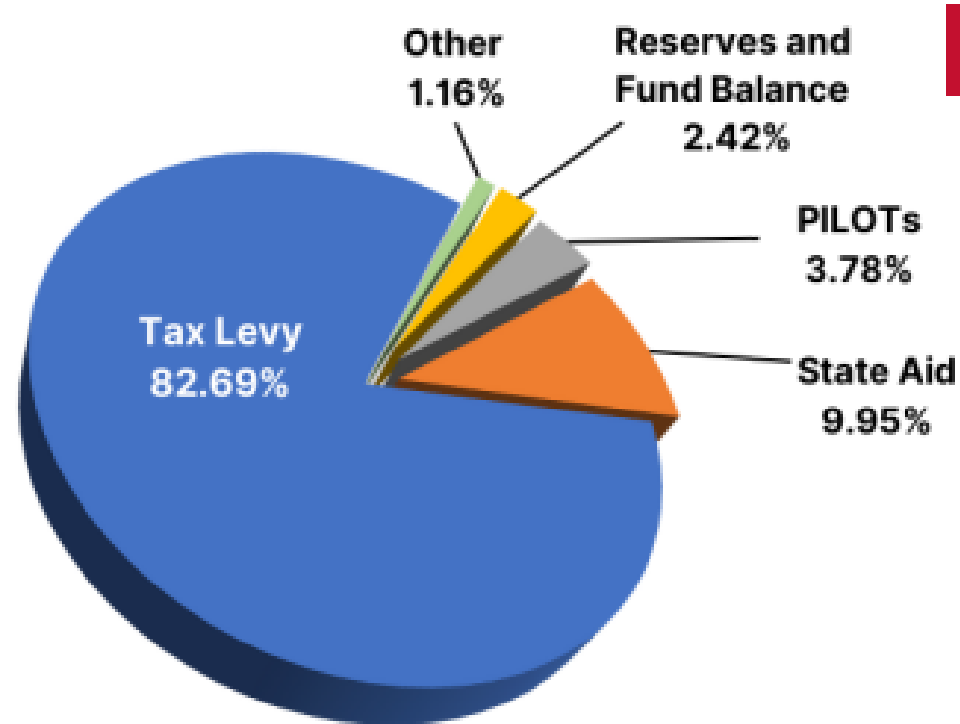

Budget Proposal Preserves Excellence, Supports Students, Invests in the Future While Remaining Below the "Tax Cap"

Dear Syosset Community,

On May 17, the community will have the opportunity to vote on the proposed budget adopted by the Syosset Board of Education for the 2022-23 school year. Despite the fiscal challenges caused by the pandemic, the budget has been carefully designed to maintain all of the programs and opportunities that make a Syosset education so special. In addition, particular attention has been made to support students' mental well-being and address any learning gaps created by the challenges of the past two years. Lastly, it provides for continued attention to our aging facilities to invest in Syosset's future.

The "Tax Cap" calculated for Syosset under New York State law is 2.61%. However, the proposed budget provides for a tax levy increase of 2.36%, which is approximately \$25K under the cap. This represents a budget increase of 4.32% over the current year, in part due to one-time facilities projects. This is the 10th year in a row of school budgets with tax increases below the State-allowed limit. This illustrates the Board's ongoing focus on maintaining academic excellence while seeking efficiencies and grants to offset the tax levy and fund capital projects.

The fiscal stability of the District positioned us well to aggressively implement health and safety protocols necessary to keep our students, our staff, and ultimately our community safe, without compromising our academic program or overlooking the evolving needs of our students and community during the shifting conditions of the pandemic. The proposed budget supports the continuation of the strong social-emotional programs that build a positive and supportive community in each school. It is the first layer of our "Culture of Care." Syosset's multi-tiered system of support that interweaves positive behavior supports, restorative practices, mental health and wellness services, and academic assistance calibrated to students' needs.

Our students' mental wellness remains a longstanding priority. Since 2017, we have hired four social workers, including persons bilingual in Mandarin and Spanish. For next year, the staffing plan includes an additional 1.5 full time social workers to further address student needs.

We are again excited to offer the community a Universal Pre-K (UPK) program completely funded by a State grant. The pilot program has been a great success, and next

year it will be expanded to run for the full school year with additional seats.

Additionally, the proposed budget allows us to continue to address the needs of the facilities throughout the district. The proposed budget includes funding to install outdoor lighting on the multi-purpose turf athletic field, which will extend the amount of time the field can be used by our athletic teams and provide low-level illumination of the track in the evening for walkers. When the field was constructed in 2019, we planned ahead by laying underground electrical conduit so the proposed lighting project can be installed without any disruption to the new field.

Also included in the proposed budget is a much-needed renovation of the South Woods Middle School library, with plans for a digital media/podcasting studio, collaborative student learning hubs, quiet reading nooks, and research presentation pods. Necessary District-wide paving, roofing, and building work is also planned.

Planning this year's budget was not without challenges – we saw significant increases in retirement system contributions (which are sensitive to stock market conditions), and especially health insurance costs as we exit the pandemic. However, the proposed budget is balanced despite these pressures and without compromising our educational program.

On May 17, in addition to the school budget vote, the community will have the opportunity to vote for three candidates for the Board of Education. Additional voting information can be found on page 4 of this newsletter.

*Should the proposed budget be deferred pursuant to Section 2023 of the Education Law the district is required to operate under a contingent budget, the district would be required to eliminate certain expenses to conform to the requirements of the law. Reductions could be made in equipment and other expenses as required by law. The District would have to take savings actions totaling about \$4 million, which may result in the elimination of some programmatic restorations in the budget such as the ICT position at the High School and additional Social Worker position. Capital projects including building repairs, paving, IRS pool ventilation, roofing repairs, and district wide masonry repairs would be delayed by at least one year.

**Propositions that are not included in the Total Budgeted Amount are listed below:

Proposition No. 2: Stillwell Property Conveyance SHALL the Board of Education of the Syosset Central School District be authorized to enter into an intermunicipal cooperation agreement for the conveyance of Stillwell Woods Preserve by the County of Nassau to the Syosset Central School District, which conveyance shall be on substantially the terms and conditions set forth in the intermunicipal agreement between the parties. Proposition No. 3: Stillwell Property Improvement Project The Board of Education of the Syosset Central School District, Nassau County, New York, is hereby authorized to construct a sports and recreational facility, including the installation of synthetic turf field(s), installation/renovation of natural grass field(s), renovation/installation of comfort/concession station(s), installation of drainage system, reconstruction of parking field(s), installation of walking/running path, and installation of field lighting at the Stillwell Fields property in Syosset, New York, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost of \$10,500,000, and that \$2,000,000 2019-2020 Capital Reserve Fund monies and \$3,000,000 monies provided by the County shall be used to pay a portion thereof, and the remaining \$5,500,000 said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and, in anticipation of such tax, up to \$3,500,000 obligations of said School District shall be issued.
