In Reader's Workshop, we will be starting a new unit called "Becoming Avid Readers". In Math, we've been busy learning about 3D shapes and we will soon be learning more about addition and subtraction. In Writing, we have been focusing on correct sentence structure and editing our work. Mr. Morton is visiting us upon our return from Spring Break. In

looking ahead, we are excited that Kindergarten Orientation is just around the corner on May 6th and 7th. Our current students will be busy practicing a few songs to sing to our new incoming Kindergartners at Orientation. First grade recently held their annual "Wild Animal Night." Over the past month, students have been busy writing non-fiction chapter books about animals, writing poetry, creating Google slides shows, building clay animals and more! All was on display for families to see at Science Night! First grade also enjoyed listening to Alicia Klepeis speak.

Second grade wants to thank the PTO for funding the buses for our field trip to New Era Field! We had such a great time and made lots of memories! They also LOVED the Author Visit and Science Night!

In March, the **3rd graders** enjoyed a lovely production of "The Jungle Book" at the TOY. We would like to thank the PTO for their generosity in helping to make that field trip possible. In ELA, the 3rd grade classes just finished our test prep unit. The unit focused on a review of all of our reading workshop strategies from the year. Next week we will be starting our nonfiction unit on Research Clubs. In math, our 3rd graders are working on fractions this month. The content varies this month for Science, Social Studies, and Writing. Each class is at different learning points with regard to those subjects.

As the weather turns warmer, we hope to get outside more often. Please make sure your children are prepared for the weather.

The **4th grade** students have done an AMAZING job with our test preparation and are ready to rock the assessment! A BIG thank you to the parents for their support and also to the kids for working so hard. We're about to move into our Historical Fiction book club unit and are excited to learn strategies for reading a new genre. We also had an amazing time with Alicia Klepeis. She was interesting, fun, and we learned a lot about how to write exciting stories. Thank you PTO for all that you do to make our school fun and exciting!

The **Fifth grade** classes would like to extend a huge thank you to the PTO for the field trip to TOY and for the Subway lunch afterward. The kids truly enjoy having the chance to mix and mingle as a whole grade level and the lunch after allows them time to do that. Science night was a great chance for the kids to show off what they've been working on with regard to our Smithsonian Science unit on Getting Freshwater to People in Need. We look forward to wrapping up the State Assessments and delving into historical fiction in our Reader's Workshop unit.

Kindergarten:

We visited NetSmartzKids.org to learn how to keep ourselves safe near strangers. "Clicky" taught us how to "Know the Rules" and "Beat the Tricks". We also began coding using a drag and drop program called "Blockly". We used Code.org and followed lessons that taught us how to click the blocks together to make the characters move.

First Grade:

We worked hard to finish our Animal Research Projects. We created a class slide show using everyone's slides. We hope you enjoyed the presentation at Science Night! We also started using our Blue Bots! We are "programming" the bots to move around a grid. We press directional buttons to move the bot from one square to another. Ask your child about it.

Second Grade:

We are still working on the Pixie project about communities: urban, rural and suburban. We have been using many different Pixie tools to create pictures of the different communities and writing about what you would see in those communities. We should be finishing this soon and sending the completed books home.

Third Grade:

We used Graph Club 2.0 to create a pictograph and a bar graph. We created a question, collected data, labeled our graphs, and entered our data. We then answered questions about our printed graphs. We also watched a "Clicky" video about using good "Netiquette". We had great discussions on what to do if someone they are online with does not use good Netiquette.

Fourth grade:

We had lots of fun using our Lego WeDo 2.0 robotics kits. They made a Spy Robot and Milo the Science Rover. Then they were able to choose and experiment with other more challenging activities. They had to be good problem solvers and work together as a group. They did a great job!
