<u>Kindergarten News</u> Mr. Morton brought hedgehogs for us in February. They were adorable and we learned so much about the life of a hedgehog.

We are working enjoying our stories unit and some of us will be starting seasons and weather soon.

In math, we are working with addition and subtraction with a very fun Dr. Seuss theme! We can't wait for Thursday.

We learned about President's Day and read non-fiction books about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln

Our 100th day was a huge success. We had so much fun with centers with the help of our great parents.

We continue to have our Olweus Class Meetings focusing on being a good friend to those around us by saying kind words and understanding and welcoming differences. We have worked hard with our Orton lessons to help our reading readiness skills.

<u>First Grade</u> ELA- We're starting Orton-Gillingham lessons after the training we had this year. We're also reading Fables.

- In math, we are counting up to the 120th day of school and will have a 1st grade celebration.
- We're taking a field trip to Albright Knox Art Museum on March 17- sponsored by Blue Cross Blue Shield.

<u>Grade 2</u> looks forward to celebrating "Dr. Seuss Day" on Thursday, March 2nd with our annual Second Grade Read-A-Thon! Students bring in a blanket from home, and have time together to read Dr, Seuss books, along with other fun special projects. We are continuing to work on learning all of our cursive letters, and our students can't wait to learn all of the letters of their names so they can start signing their papers with their cursive signature.

<u>Third Grade</u> is learning about fables, folktales and fairy tales this month. We are figuring out the moral or lesson a story teaches, using text details to support our ideas, and discussing how these morals/lessons apply in our own lives.

In Math, will continue to review multiplication and apply these skills to solving for area. Our fraction unit will begin soon. Cooking with your children and using measuring cups can be a great way to reinforce the everyday use of fractions at home.

Our science curriculum involving the study of rocks and minerals is our next unit, and in social studies we will continue the study of the US and our government.

4th Grade

Our 4th graders are really working hard!

* In ELA, we are in the midst of our study of nonfiction. We are working on several projects including reading and writing expository texts, biographies, and narrative nonfiction. We had a special visit to kick off the unit from the Buffalo Beauts, who entertained us with a nonfiction hockey read aloud! The kids loved meeting the players, as well as a Silver Medal Olympian! *We are continuing our study of fractions in math, which encompasses equivalent fractions, adding/subtracting fractions, and comparing/ordering fractions.

*In Science, we are beginning our study of electricity. This is a very fun, hands-on unit that the children are sure to love!

Finally, we are anxiously awaiting our trip with Earth Spirit to learn about how maple syrup is made. All teachers and students are really looking forward to this exciting field trip!

5th Grade is prepping for a trip to the Buffalo Museum of Science. We will also be "attending" a virtual field trip to Alaska to check out the native food chains. We are working on fractions in math, non-fiction in Reader's Workshop, and Motion and Design in science.

<u>Library News-</u> Just a big thank you to the PTO for all the help checking out books to kids, reshelving them and keeping the library looking nice and organized.

Our kids are great readers and have checked out 27,000 books this year so far. 5900 in February alone! That's a lot of books to put back on the shelf!

Kindergarten:

We used the iPads to practice our handwriting skills with "Letter School" and our math skills with "Bugs and Bubbles" and "Bugs and Numbers" We then used Pixie 4 to create a poster of "100 things for our 100th day". We also started a project about the 4 seasons using Pixie 4.

First Grade:

We used Pixie 4 to create Valentines for Veterans. We created a card and added a short message for the veterans in our area. We began using a site called "The Foos" that teaches very basic coding skills. I am blown away at how quickly the students are catching on to this. We also used NetSmartzKids.org to learn how to be safer online and in the real world (Stranger Danger).

Second Grade:

We are reading about topics that interest us and then writing a fact or 2 (in our own words) that we learned about that topic. We also continued working on our Communities project.
