Teacher's Report-

Kindergarten

- February was a busy month in kindergarten! Mr. Morton brought his prairie dogs, we had our Valentine's Day Craft Party, the children participated in Hundredth Day Centers, and Tiffany Vanderwerff, from the Buffalo Zoo, came to Ellicott and shared a wonderful presentation about Polar Bears.
- Our themes included Groundhog Day, Presidents' Day, and Valentine's Day. We also finished up our reading unit on stories.
- Next month, we are looking forward to our St. Patrick's Day Craft Party and Mr. Morton's next visit. We will also be learning about 3-D Shapes, Dental Health, and will begin our unit on Seasons and Weather.

First Grade

- *Thank you for paying for the MILK MAGICIAN Rob Allen and his wife Carol to visit our school.
- *We LOVE the book fair. Thanks for bringing Mr. Silver to Ellicott again!
- *In math, we are working on adding and subtracting within word problems.
- *In ELA, we are reading wonderful FABLES and learning important LESSONS. We sure love the domains and themes that we are teaching now!
- *In science and health, we have covered dental health.
- *In social studies, we are learning about our school and the community around us.

2nd Grade had "Explore & More" come in to review the "States of Matter" with our students by demonstrating with lots of fun experiments. Thank you to the PTO for funding this enrichment activity for our students!

We will be attending an assembly on "Dental Health" on Tuesday, March 1st. Thank you to Mrs. Lawless for organizing that for us!

We will be celebrating Dr. Seuss' birthday on March 2nd with "Read Across America Day" and a 2nd grade read-athon.

Also in reading, we will soon begin our read-aloud, "Charlotte's Web".

Third grade learned about addition and subtraction in math, and our classes are starting the unit on area next. We continue to encourage the students to practice and become fluent with their multiplication facts. In science, we completed our unit on Buoyancy and will be starting Rocks and Minerals soon. In Social Studies, we are learning about the United States and our government. We also started our unit on fairy tales and fables in ELA. Students are learning how to determine the lesson of the story and explain it with sufficient details. We are also discussing character traits, actions and motivations.

4th Grade will be wrapping up our fraction unit and will be moving on to geometry. In ELA we are enjoying novel studies with our students. Throughout these novels, students will analyze the main characters, identify problems and solutions, discuss the settings, describe the moral, and answer

corresponding comprehension questions. We have moved through our digestion and energy mini-units in Science. The students will focus on their Land and Water unit next. In Social Studies we are wrapping up Colonial America and will then begin discussing the American Revolution. We are also preparing for the Author Visit by creating Fraction Books, which ties in to our current math unit. Finally, 4th Grade will have the opportunity to enjoy our Maple Sugaring Fieldtrip in March, which reinforces concepts learned in Social Studies regarding the Iroquois.

5th Grade -We'll be selling pizza and pop at the Spring Fling. Darien Lake is scheduled for June 16th, and we are hoping that lots of 5th grade parents can join us.

Kindergarten:

We began a new program called Island Adventure. This program has fun activities that review letter sounds and builds a strong site vocabulary. We'll revisit this often throughout the rest of the year. We also began using MathSeeds on the internet to practice our math skills. We used www.Minimouse.us to practice out mouse skills. We then used Pixie 4 to create a poster of "100 things for our 100th day". We used the iPads to practice our handwriting skills with "Letter School" and our math skills with "Splash Math"

First Grade:

Se went on www.NetsmartzKids.org to learn about "Stranger Danger". We began using MathSeeds online to practice our math skills. We used Pixie4 to create Valentines for Veterans. We also used "First Grade Learning Games" on the iPads to practice both Math skills and Language skills. We began a unit on Dinosaurs. We used a program called "Learn About Dinosaurs". We read information and answered questions about dinosaurs and sell as played matching games and listened to songs that taught us about dinosaurs.

Second Grade:

We began the New Year by writing our resolutions. We used "Word" to type a letter to our families explaining a bad habit we will try to stop and a good habit we will work harder on this year. We are using www.PebbleGo.com to do research on various subjects. We are writing a log of the information we find. We are practicing writing the information in our own words instead of copying it from the internet. We used Pixie4 to create Valentines for Veterans. We also continue to work on our Communities project using Pixe4.

Third Grade:

We began the New Year by writing our resolutions with "Word". We practiced our home row typing as we wrote letters to our family. We learned how to use the computer to help us with spell check, but we know we can't rely on that for every word. We also used www.Tagxedo.com to create word clouds for our Valentines for Veterans project. We began coding this month! We used www.Tynker.com to learn the basics of writing code. Check it out at home! We are now starting a

graph project. We are collecting data to graph and will create a bar graph and a pictograph.

Fourth grade:
