OPCSD Administrators Receive Safety Training

In July the Orchard Park Central School District Administrative team was trained by Lieutenant Patrick Fitzgerald of the Orchard Park Police Department on the Incident Command System.

The Incident Command System or ICS is a standardized, on-scene all-hazard incident management approach. This approach allows the school district and any responders to adopt a structure of how incidents would be handled and it can vary depending on the type of incident. The ICS training also emphasized the need for a common language between all school district administrators and the different emergency responders. Having this type of system enables Administrators to know what role they play in each type of emergency, and how jobs and responsibilities would be delegated so the incident could be handled in the most efficient way possible.

It has been a very busy summer in the Orchard Park Central School District due to the extensive amount of work taking place in our buildings because of the capital improvement project. We will be ready for the start of the school year and I am looking forward to welcoming back our staff on Wednesday, August 31 and our students on Tuesday, September 6.

The project work will continue during the school year in the Middle School auditorium and in the Middle School pool. While we are still undergoing construction, I would encourage everyone to check the district website and online calendar for updated events and location information. Not only is the website a great place to go for updated event information, it is also a great resource for both parents and students. Construction is not the only area

of improvement in the district. When we return in September, there will be changes to the district's security and safety procedures. Throughout the past year the administrative team has been working to improve school building access and control before, during, and after student attendance hours. The district is focused on continuing to improve safety measures. Visitors will now be required to show photo identification, i.e. drivers' licenses, in order to gain access into the buildings. Each building will now have full-time security monitors during the school day and security monitors after school hours. Throughout the summer, the administrative team and the clerical staff received safety training to improve communication during an emergency. We will continue to make safety and security a top priority.

Finally, as we prepare for the start of the upcoming school year, I know we all wish the class of 2016 great success as they begin their college experiences, join the work force or the armed services. We wish them well in their future endeavors.

Orchard Park Pride Awards 2016-2017

Each year, approximately 10 percent of students in the senior class are selected to receive an Orchard Park Pride Award. This award is given to those who have exhibited excellence in one or more of the following areas: character, work ethic, and involvement and impact. Not everyone who exhibits these qualities will be chosen. Selection is made on the basis of information submitted on the OP Pride Form, as well as faculty votes. Each student who is chosen will be paired with a local business representative who will host the student and his/her parents at a dinner in the spring.

We are asking students to self-nominate by submitting the OP Pride Form to Mrs. See or Mrs. Linder in House III by November 1st. The forms are available in the House offices.** Only students who have completed this form, checked the Orchard Park Pride box at the top, and submitted it by November 1st will be considered in the voting process.

This is not a time to be overly modest. If students have contributed to Orchard Park through activities in the classroom, in the community, or in school sports, clubs, or organizations, we encourage them to self-nominate by submitting the OP Pride Form. The process is similar to submitting a resume to apply for a job and we feel this will be a good learning experience.

Click on Guidance and Counseling Services (in the left column). Select Orchard Park Pride Awards. Select Related Files – OP Pride Form. Open the OP Pride form, fill it out, save it, and print three copies – one for your records, one for Mrs. See or Mrs. Linder, and one for your counselor.

Practice Plus Time Equals Success

In his 2008 best selling book, Outliers: The Story of Success, Malcom Gladwell contended the difference between world-class experts and people of typical skill level is practice. In his study of athletes, experts in their field of study, or other world-class individuals, the magic number of 10,000 hours of practice was revealed. The notion of devoting hours and hours of practice to enhance a skill can be applied to many aspects of schooling – from learning a musical instrument to learning how to read. The vast majority of people are not naturally gifted; their natural skills coupled with hours of practice is what leads to success.

Throughout the past school year, teachers in grades 3-6 have participated

in professional development focused on literacy instruction in the Reading Workshop model. Many leaders in the field of reading instruction from Lucy Calkins to Richard Allington have researched the connections between time "practicing" reading and reading achievement. Simply put, to improve reading skills our students must have ample time on task reading. Practicing reading will improve our students' reading abilities.

The Reading Workshop model of instruction is anchored in the philosophy that kids need to read a lot, with high comprehension, in order to improve their reading skills. This instructional model allows for students to read every day for approximately 30 uninterrupted minutes. A vital element of this reading instruction is for students to be given adequate time reading text they are able to

read independently, meaning text that is an appropriate reading level where a child is not frustrated and able to comprehend what he/she is reading.

In a Reading Workshop model, students read text (i.e. books) of differing levels. The beauty of this is that those students who are reading above grade level can be appropriately challenged with above grade level texts, while struggling readers can be provided texts at their reading level. In doing so, students can be challenged to stretch and grow without being pushed beyond their reach, which would result in frustration. The Reading Workshop model is differentiated instruction, responsive to the individual needs of our diverse readers.

As we focus on increasing students' independent reading time, we encourage families to continue to support reading at home. Whether reading to your child, having your child read to you, or the encouragement of independent reading time, practicing reading will improve students' reading skills.

A Word From The Board of Education President

On behalf of the Board of Education I would like to welcome everybody back to a new school year. I would like to take this opportunity to welcome two members to the Board: Robert Mahany and Dwight Eagan. Please congratulate them as you see them about town.

It has been a busy summer throughout the district. There has been significant progress made on the health and safety construction project with the work beginning this past spring. While every building is being impacted, the most noticeable is the middle school's parking lot and the main entryway repairs. While some work will continue into the winter, we have been assured that other than the work being done to repair the middle school pool, the rest of the project work should not impact the normal operations of any of the buildings or the academic day.

Over the summer the board received a technology update on the rolling out of a new batch of chrome books to both the middle school and high school students. This is part of the New York State

Smart School Investment Plan, a 2.2 billion dollar program to enhance technology throughout the state. Our Board will be holding a public hearing related to this program on August 29th at 6 p.m. in the district office. Please feel free to attend if you would like the information about this exciting opportunity for our students and the district.

We will also be reviewing the mandated building condition survey which is done every five years. Once this is finished we will be reconstituting the facilities committee which will be tasked with making recommendations for the next phase in our long-term capital project. We hope to receive these recommendations by the end of 2017. Community members who are interested in being part of this committee should contact the superintendent's office.

Thank you for your continued support of the district, especially our students. The Board of Education welcomes input from community members on all aspects, particularly with respect to how we can continue to improve transparency, communication and promote a greater partnership with the community. - 8. Emergency, School Closing and Attendance require one number to be selected
