Orchard Park Middle School has been chosen as one of four schools throughout the country to pilot Disney's *The Little Mermaid, Jr.* The show will be presented on Friday, November 19 at 7 p.m., and Saturday, November 20 at 2:30 p.m. Disney's *The Little Mermaid, Jr.* is an hour long show featuring songs

from the original animated film and the Broadway score, with music by Alan Menken and lyrics by Howard Ashman and Glenn Slater.

The show features over 100 Middle School students, including the following as leads: Miranda Herreid as Ariel; Jourdan Pouliot as Prince Eric; Caroline Schettler as Ursula; Evan Stoddard as Sebastian; Dylan Manzanares as Flounder; Adam England as King Triton; Victoria Miller as Flotsam; Liz Crinzi as Jetsam and Rachel Deemer as Scuttle.

The Little Mermaid, Jr. also features a chorus of over 70 students, including 9 dancers. The show is directed and co-produced by Syndi Buscagalia, with music direction and co-production by Melissa Smith; choreography by Megan Sreniawski, and technical direction by Mike Pikula.

Tickets will be on sale beginning Monday, November 15 during all lunch periods (10:45 a.m. - 1 p.m.) in the Middle School Foyer. Tickets are \$4 for adults and \$2 for students (17 and under) and senior citizens with a Gold Card. If tickets remain, they will also be on sale at the door prior to performances.

Superintendent's Column

hope this column finds you well and keeping warm as the mercury begins to drop. With the start of the school year well underway, we are now gearing up for parent/teacher conferences. the first round of report cards, and of course, the looming threat of snow!

As we move from fall to winter, the viability of closing for weather becomes an even greater possibility. The decision to close school because of adverse weather conditions is not made lightly or easily. It involves many consultations with the weather bureau, highway supervisors and police in the six towns which compose the district.

Once the decision to close has been made, area radio stations are informed, including WBEN, WNED, WUFO, WHTT and WJYE. Closing information will also be shared with the following television stations: WGRZ, WIVB and WKBW. If the District has power, the closing will also be posted on the Disrict's website at www.opschools.org

On occasion, an emergency may necessitate the closing of one school, but not the other schools in the District. Single building closings also will be announced on the above stations. Please note that if schools are closed due to inclement weather, all other activities, including sports practices, co-curriculars and Community Education classes will be canceled.

In addition to learning of school closings via the local media, you may also receive alerts to your e-mail address or cellular phone through the District's "ED Alert" system. Ed

Alert is a service that provides parents, students, faculty/ staff and community members the opportunity to sign up to receive e-mails and/or text messages on school related information. The District uses the system to keep subscribers informed of school closings, early dismissals, event cancellations and other important information. If you would like to receive announcements and communications, you can opt-in using the following steps:

- ·Click 'Ed Alert' under 'Quick Links' on the main page.
- Fill in your information using all lowercase for your email address.
- ·Subscribe to the email list appropriate for you. Most users subscribe to "Emergency Notifications."
- Be sure to click the "sign me up" button.

Your information will never be shared with anyone outside of the District and you will always have the option to unsubscribe from any list. This can be done from any email message you receive from Orchard Park. If you use a spam blocker, please ensure that it will let emails from "opschools. org" through. Also please note that due to size restrictions, text messages will include a maximum of 160 characters.

Closing During the School Day
On rare occasions, it may be necessary to close a school during the day due to loss of power, loss of water or other emergency situations. If this occurs, procedures are in place to transport students to another building, if necessary.

If weather turns bad during the school day, students will remain at school until the weather is clear enough to travel. Typical practice is to begin the dismissal process early, which allows the extra travel time needed in bad weather to get home close to the regular time. To increase the potential for older siblings to be home when the younger ones arrive, the dismissal sequence starts with High School students. Middle School dismissal follows, and Elementary students are dismissed last.

Families are encouraged to have a plan in place in the event that a parent or older sibling cannot be home for the returning youngster(s). Please be sure your children are familiar with an alternate place to go, like a specific friend or neighbor. Also, please make sure that your parental and emergency contact information is up to date on the Parent Portal. If changes need to be made to your contact information, please contact Karen Sienk at 209-6325.

In an effort to advance Character Education throughout the building, Ellicott Elementary launched the Character Cafe in November 2009. Technology Class Captures First Prize in Trebuchet Contest

Mr. Steve Kennedy's Principles of Engineering class at Orchard Park High School won first place in two of three categories in the Trebuchet Contest held at the Great Pumpkin Farm in Clarence Center on Sunday, October 17, 2010.

The OP Trebuchet team competed against 14 area high schools in the contest, where each team has three turns to launch an eight lb. pumpkin for distance and accuracy. The OPHS Technology class had the longest pumpkin throw, a distance of 364 feet, 17 feet further than the old record set by North Tonawanda in 2009. The junior/senior team won the total distance throw with a total of 1,027 feet, shattering the old record by 97 feet.

The students designed a double cam action arm, which applied power to the pumpkin over a greater distance. The change in cam design showed an increase in distance of 11% from last year's best throw.

The top prize of \$1,100 dollars will help purchase electronics for a robotic project started last year.

The following documentation is required for registration of students new to the District:

- Two proofs of residency (i.e. rental agreement, purchase agreement, utility bills)
- Birth certificate
- •Immunization record from your child's physician
- •Report card from previous school (please note that High School registrants need a transcript of all HS credits from grade 8-12)
- Custody papers (if applicable)
- Copy of IEP or 504 plan (if applicable)

Parents are required to fill out the following forms for registration: new student registration form, home language questionnaire, health appraisal form, records request form and dental form.

Local Volunteer Companies Teach Fire Prevention and Awareness

Firemen from the Orchard Park and Hillcrest Volunteer Fire Companies recently volunteered their time to teach children the importance of fire safety and prevention.

The Orchard Park Fire Company visited South Davis Elementary with their Safety House, which simulates how quickly a room can fill with smoke after a fire breaks out. The volunteers explained fire safety to the students and recommended that families do these things at home:

- 1. Have several fire drills at home with a safe meeting place in the side or back yard.
- 2. Change all smoke alarm batteries twice a year (a good reminder is to change them for Daylight Savings Time.)
- 3. Have a fire extinguisher and make sure all family members know where it is.

Meanwhile, at Ellicott Elementary, students learned firsthand how to operate a fire extinguisher with help from volunteers from the Hillcrest Volunteer Fire Company. Students were provided with the chance to don fire gear and practice using a fire extinguisher to put out the flames in a controlled fire. They also learned more about first responders and how to help in an emergency.

We extend thanks to our local firefighters for volunteering their time and giving back to both the District and the community.

Special thanks are extended to the Orchard Park Alumni Association for their generous donation of \$7,605 which was used to purchase a custom marimba for use by the District. High School Band Directors Chris Revett and Don Carducci are pictured here with Senior David Suriani (center), a percussionist with the band. Academy of Finance Receives Assistance from Board Member Donated Services Help Academy Move Closer to Opening Student Branch

The dream of a student-run bank branch at the High School will soon be a reality, thanks to the efforts and contributions of a very dedicated board member of the Academy of Finance.
Chris Repp, AOF advisory board member and owner of Repp Construction, was instrumental in the construction of the soon to open Orchard Park High School Academy of Finance bank branch, with his company donating more than \$17,000 worth of supplies, time and services. Located just off the cafeteria, the branch will be entirely student run and will provide students with hands on experience in managing money.

Staff from Repp construction worked with the High School to first conduct research needed to identify the requirements of an operational banking facility. They then designed a functional workplace within the available space,

ordered materials and organized a work crew to ensure timely completion. Fabrication of materials needed began at Repp Constructions's millwork shop with the building of custom oak cabinetry to accommodate teller stations. Once completed, the room was prepped by adding a new suspended ceiling and lighting, and an interior designer was provided to select the wall color, countertops and flooring. The bank is currently ready for the next phase, when a community banking partner will be chosen to work with the Academy.
