The Orchard Park Central School District has appointed Jeffrey Dolce as assistant principal at the Middle School and Dr. Lisa Krueger as House III principal at the High School. Dolce, former curriculum and staff development coordinator for the District, has replaced former assistant principal Eleanor Payne, while Krueger will replace former House III principal David Lilleck, who was appointed Middle School principal late last year.

Dolce joined the District in 2006 after serving as coordinator of staff and curriculum development for Erie 1 BOCES/WNYRIC. He has also held positions in the classroom and as project leader at the Center for Applied Technologies in Education at the University at Buffalo. He holds certification in school district administration from Canisius College, and received a master's degree in education and bachelor of science in elementary education, both from SUNY Fredonia.

Krueger has served as principal of Eggert Road Elementary School since 2004, and as coordinator of the District's Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program since 2007. She has been honored with the Emerging Leader Award from D'Youville College and was twice recognized as a Leader in Education by Business First of Buffalo. She recently earned her doctoral degree in education from D'Youville College, having defended her dissertation on school bullying. Krueger earned a master of science in education administration from Canisius College and a master of science in elementary education from SUNY Buffalo, and holds certification in school district administration. Dr. Krueger will begin her position at the High School on July 1.

he graduation season is upon us and our school District recently recognized a cohort of students that completed program requirements for graduation from the Academy of Finance. I was fortunate enough to represent the District at the graduation ceremony (see photos on the next page). I feel compelled to brag a bit about this wonderful program, especially after reflecting on everything the students and the academy accomplished. We really do an amazing job as a District and community in providing such rich and diverse learning experiences for our children.



The Academy of Finance is a school within the High School that provides students with excellent foundational knowledge and skills for higher education in the field of finance. This program has a short history of just six years, but our teachers and community leaders have packaged together an amazing opportunity for students. Twenty-six seniors graduated this year from this nationally certified program.

Their journey began four years ago as a cohort homeroom group. During this time period, they have completed a rigorous and relevant curriculum including course studies in Microsoft Office, accounting, leadership, personal finance, banking and credit, and economics. Students also participate in a paid internship placement. It is interesting to note that our students were prepared and performed so well in their internships, 50% of the students continued to work at the same placement.

The graduation ceremony also highlighted the awarding of five scholarships secured by the Business Department and the Advisory Board. The recipients

Our Academy of Finance Board has over 30 members that meet monthly and work behind the scenes securing paid internships in a poor economy,

In closing, I want to recognize and thank the Business Department and the Advisory Board for their tireless effort to provide students with such a high quality and valuable learning experience. It is also fitting that our Finance of Academy students are congratulated one final time on their outstanding accomplishment.


