Happy December! This year is flying by and we are learning so much every day. The weather is getting colder so please make sure to send your child with a coat or jacket to school every day so we can stay healthy and warm!

In reading we are still practicing letter names and sound recognition, but we are now using those sounds to blend and read CVC words. We are also adding to the high frequency words we know and practice daily.

In math we are continuing to count to 100, learning ways to combine numbers, and are even starting to learn the attributes of shapes!

Kindergarten is beginning to send home homework. Please make sure you spend some time every day working on the packets we send home as well as counting to 100 and reading. Every day we are learning so much, so please make sure to stay healthy and come to school!



Hi Everyone! Happy December! We have lots of exciting things coming up this month. We have started building teen numbers and adding/subtracting teen numbers in Math. In phonics, we will continue to read and write words with consonant blends as well as words with digraphs sh, th, and -ng. In Benchmark the next unit will be about how people create stories. In Science we are finishing up learning about plants and animals. We will begin Unit 2, observing the sky.

Our winter concert will be held on December 19th at 5:30pm. Please continue to check your child's folder daily.




Hello December! In second grade, we will be learning so many new and exciting things! In ECRI, we are continuing learning new affixes, sounds, trick words, sentences and contractions. In Math, we are learning to add and subtract two-digit numbers while finding a missing addend. We will be using different strategies to help us, such as: baseten blocks and open number lines adding up to ten. We are also learning about adding and subtracting with money and telling time. In our current Benchmark unit, we are learning about how folktales can teach us important lessons.

In reading for this month, we are starting Unit 4 in Benchmark.

We will be working on "Comparing Points of View." In this unit, we'll be reading plays, humor, a folktale as well as a diary entry from a fictional character. To compare points of view, we'll study familiar stories that have been given fresh twists. At the beginning of December, students will be tested to see the progress on their fluency. Students should be reading aloud every day at home. By January, students should be able to read 105 words per minute to be considered on-grade level.

Our students are still learning strategies to solve multiplication facts and problems. All students should now be able to say the multiples (skip-count) of 2, 3, 5, and 10. We will be learning the multiples of 4 next. Please continue to have your child skip-count and practice multiplication facts (0-3, 5, and 10). Third graders will be taking the Middle-of-Year i-Ready Assessment the week of December 16th.



In English/Language Arts, students will be starting Unit 4, which focuses on fictional stories told from different points of view and perspectives—both human and animal. As always, please make sure you are reading with your children every night to help increase their fluency, which is extremely important!

For Math, will be moving into multi-digit multiplication and multi-digit division (for example, 35x34 or 345/5). For this unit, it is especially important that students work on both their multiplication and division fact fluency.

Finally, in Science, we will be starting our Engineering and Technology Unit. This unit explores how engineers define a problem, design a solution and improve prototypes.

Hi Parents/Guardians! Welcome to December! Could you believe we only have a few more weeks left of 2024?

Here are some updates about what we are working on in the fifth grade. In math, we are learning about decimals and will continue working on decimals for a few more weeks. We will learn how to add and subtract decimals, as well as multiply and divide decimals. Students are working hard to practice and memorize their multiplication facts which will help them with the content. We will finish up with Unit 3 and move onto Unit 4 for ELA. A key skill will be identifying the author's point of view. The students will also be working on writing narratives.

Finally, in Science, we are currently finishing up in our unit in Matter, and will be moving on to Systems in Space.

Friendly reminder, please practice math fact fluency and reading fluency daily with your child to help them grow.

Our Intervention groups continue to practice their decoding skills by blending sounds together to make words. We also are working on fluency skills, such as: reading as if we are talking, with expression. Please know that Mrs. Pronovost's students have a plastic folder which should come to class and go home each day. The students come home with papers for practice and books to read. Please have your child read at least 10 minutes each night and fill in the Reading Log that is in the folder. Only grades 1-5 have a reading log.

All students have been working effortlessly in their small groups to improve their reading. Our students are placed in groups based on their individual needs. Your child is monitored weekly to assess the progress he/she is making and instruction is adjusted if necessary so we can ensure your child is progressing. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you are in need of reading materials at home. We will be more than happy to help you begin to build an at-home library for your child.



Based on research, children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and first grade are less likely to read on grade level by the third grade. For older students, being chronically absent is strongly associated with low grades and students are more likely to drop out of high school. When students are consistently absent from school, not only do they run the risk of falling behind their peers academically, but they also exhibit poor self-esteem.
