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Letter from Melissa Goho, Primary School Principal

Summer is around the corner! Our DPS students have achieved many accomplishments this year and they continue to grow academically and socially. We were thrilled to have Open House on Tuesday, May 3, 2022. The event gave students an opportunity to give their family a tour of our building, introduce them to all the faculty they learn with each day, and show off the hard work that they have been doing all year.

Our March parent-teacher conferences provided an opportunity for teachers to share with families student growth as well as answer questions about how to best support learning at home. We had 91% of families participate in

conferences. This shows that we know collaboration is the key to student success!

We held a second application process for the Student Lighthouse Team and this round included our 4PK students. We are continuing to support students' social-emotional learning through our Leader in Me lessons, either facilitated by the classroom teacher or the guidance counselor, as well as monthly classroom lessons by the guidance counselors on topics such as asking someone to play, coping skills, or interrupting. Additionally, I'm holding a monthly virtual morning meeting with the whole school. These meetings include a read aloud and conversation about how to be a leader. Our new playground should be accessible soon. That will give students lots of opportunities to have fun playing together with students from their own classroom and other classrooms as well as a physical outlet.

We are pleased to offer a summer program again this year. This is an opportunity for current 4PK through 2nd grade students to join a classroom teacher for two hours a day in the morning, four days a week, to continue learning and practicing reading, writing, and math skills.

The upcoming weeks are full of end of the year events! We have field trips, a sing along, bike safety activities, guest Rotary Readers, field days, and other celebrations. What a great way to head into summer vacation!


State Fair

There is much to be proud of at DHS. We emphasize recognizing our students and celebrating their accomplishments. Throughout this newsletter we have tried to highlight students for their academic, athletic and musical achievements. DHS takes pride in offering students unlimited opportunities to be successful and that is on full display in this newsletter. Additionally, over 400 Positive Postcards have been mailed home to recognize students for their efforts in demonstrating our core values: Learn - Lead - Succeed.

This spring has shaped up to be just as eventful as the first half of the school year. Our spring sports were competitive. The high school musical, "The Little Mermaid" was outstanding! Over 60 students and multiple members of our faculty & staff participated in this event. The sellout crowds were proof that our students' performances were nothing short of





DHS Science Teacher Nikki Allen

Congratulations to DHS science teacher Nikki Allen, who is also a Geneseo adjunct professor! Nikki is a key member of the Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program, which was awarded \$1,447,654. The other members of this team are Lecturer

in Biology Rob Feissner, Associate Professor of Geological Sciences Amy Sheldon, MCC Professor of Geology Jessica Barone, and MCC Professor of Geosciences Amanda Colosimo. The project, "Supporting and Preparing Future STEM Teachers through Scholarships and Teaching Experiences," expands on our current Noyce award. The new program establishes a partnership between SUNY Geneseo and Monroe Community College (MCC) to promote the Noyce program to MCC students and help build a pathway to Geneseo for aspiring STEM teachers.

The aim of the project is to attract, recruit, and nurture SUNY Geneseo STEM undergraduates as they earn their BA degrees and meet the requirements for New York State teaching certification. The grant will provide funds to support early teaching experiences, including summer internships in informal learning environments, such as museums; intersession in-classroom internships; pre-internship 1-credit courses for both the summer and intersession internships; a STEM Education Creation Team program (modeled after our current Noyce award's Build It, Teach It, Leave It program); mentoring by Master Teachers from our NYS Master Teachers Program; and funds to support a minimum of 18 unique scholarship recipients during their junior and senior years plus, if needed, additional support for their 9th-semester student teaching.

Nikki Allen has been an integral part of the DHS science department since 2001. Please join us in congratulating the entire team for a job well done!

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Ms. Pam Mark's Last Concert! 32 Years... Over 3,000 New Musicians

Pam Mark, high school band teacher, conducted her last band concert in March. Pam (affectionately known as "PMark") has been with the Dansville music department since 1997. She has led the Marching Mustangs, and has conducted the concert band for 25 years.



Pam graduated from Canaseraga Central Schools in 1984. She went on to receive her associates at Onondaga Community College. She then attended Nazareth College where she earned a Bachelor's Degree in K-12 Music Education, and a Masters Degree in Educational Administration at SUNY Brockport.

In Fall of 1991 Pam was hired at her alma mater in Canaseraga, teaching 4-12 instrumental music. Over the next 6 years, Pam's love for music and people is shown throughout Steuben, Allegany and Livingston counties, when her students played at concerts and festivals.
