



Dear Parents and Community,

June is a time to celebrate accomplishments along with finishing up the year strong! Our goal is for students to be as ready as they can be for the next school year in the areas of academics as well as learner and leader habits. Along with finishing up the current units of instruction, we will be assessing students to see the progress they have made throughout the year, going on field trips, honoring Flag Day, holding a field day event and whole school lunch, having end of year classroom celebrations, and inviting students to a moving up day where they will meet the next grade level of teachers. Families will also be busy celebrating DPS students at

the following events: 4PK Career Parade and Celebration, 2nd Grade General Music Informance, Kindergarten Graduation, and our DPS Morning Meeting Leadership Celebration. We also invite families to bring students to our upcoming Camp Read-A-Lot event where students get to engage in literacy as well as STEAM activities and projects.

The arts were highlighted in the month of May at DPS. We had a phenomenal district wide art show display in the halls of the High School that included artwork from every DPS student. Miss Pullen has certainly been inspiring our students as their creativity and talent was on full display. Also, Rev Theatre visited for a performance titled Huff and Puff: A Pig Tale. Eggstravaganza



Dansville Primary School teaching assistant Joie Petrillo was awarded the National Certificate for STEM Teaching, the #1 STEM teaching certification in the country. Described as "dedicated and diligent," the experience was a reminder of why all great teachers begin teaching; Ms.

Petrillo is incredibly excited to continue fostering bright, independent learners. Joie said "I find this accomplishment both personally and professionally fulfilling, " and says she has already begun applying more advanced lesson scaffolding techniques as well as encouraging increased communication amongst fellow educators for student success.

The National Certificate for STEM Teaching is an online, competency-based professional development program for preK-12 teachers. It focuses on high-impact STEM instructional strategies that work synergistically across content areas. Designed with working educators in mind, the NCST is personalized, job-embedded, standards-focused, and convenient. Participants can start the 100% online, self-paced program at any time, with support from a virtual STEM coach.

4PK students enjoyed a visit from the Zoomobile. They got to see animals that use their senses in ways that are different from us, such as a turtle, rat, and snake.

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Congratulations to the Class of 2023! They will be formally recognized at the Commencement Ceremony on June 23rd at 8pm (Location: Dansville Central School District - Sports Complex).

This was an outstanding school year! At DHS we achieved new levels of success academically, athletically, in the fine arts and with our focus on social & emotional learning. Dansville High School's motto: **Learn - Lead - Succeed** has never been any truer. Over 500 postcards have been mailed home by DHS employees to recognize students for their efforts to achieve our core values (this is over 100 more than last school year). Additionally, about 50 students in 7th & 8th grade have redeemed "Mustang Money" that was earned for exemplifying the characteristics

associated with learner responsibilities.

April, May and June include a lot of academic assessments. Students in 7th & 8th grade took NYS ELA and Math exams. While students in 8th grade took the NYS Science exam. Results from the state exams are typically available in September. Over 40 students in grades 10th-12th took at least one or more Advanced Placement Exams (results will be available on July 5th). Students associated with Regents courses will take Regents exams in late June. I appreciate our faculty for their hard work throughout the school year to prepare students to be successful on the exams.

Our students have been very fortunate to participate in a variety of field trips this school year. These opportunities build interests, enhance knowledge and expose students to cultural experiences. They are an important part of the educational process. You can see examples of such field trips in this newsletter and on our district's Facebook page.

As we move closer to the end of the school year, it is important that we continue working together to meet the needs of our students. For our future 7th graders, we are so excited to have you join DHS. You will receive information this summer about our 7th grade orientation program (Pony Express).

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
