Dansville Schools are about inclusive education, unwavering support for children and continual improvement. This path places the needs of our students above all else. As Dansville rises, we know that we couldn't achieve so much without the commitment of so many. We remain so very grateful for our faculty, staff, school leaders, students, their families and our supportive community and we look forward to seeing everyone in September!



Letter from Dan Dixon, Primary School Principal

The Dansville Primary School finished the year in celebratory fashion with pre-kindergarten graduation, kindergarten graduation and our End-of-The-Year Leadership Celebration. Families and friends joined us to help celebrate the hard work that students had put in all year. At the Leadership Celebration, classes and students were recognized for learning and living the "7 Habits" as well as achieving their Wildly Important Goals (WIG) for the year.



I hope all faculty and families use this summer to relax and sharpen the saw. In the fall, we will be

introducing students to our newly created Early Math Profile (EMP). The Early Math Profile was developed based on mathematical foundational standards. It assesses the important number concepts, operations, geometry, and measurement and data and gives an individual account of each student's strengths and needs. The purpose of the Early Math Profile is:

- 1. To model a framework of early number concepts of what is important for students to learn in mathematics and what is important to assess.
- 2. To provide a developmental math assessment that can be used to assess number concepts, operations, geometry, measurement and data.
- 3. To provide a readiness assessment to determine if students are ready to begin grade-level work.
- 4. To determine each student's level of understanding on grade-level expectations.
- 5. To monitor progress throughout the year.
- 6. To facilitate communication between teachers and parents so parents feel more informed about their child's strengths and needs in mathematics.

I hope you all have a relaxing and enjoyable summer. I know it will go by extremely fast. Please take advantage of all that the school and community have to offer this summer such as summer recreation, summer reading, summer enrichment, library summer events and our school summer breakfast and lunch programs.

Dear Parents and Community,

On June 14 - our annual Flag Day/Leadership Day - we spent some time celebrating our students and their accomplishments from this year. I continue to be impressed with what I see and hear from our students. They change and grow so much from when they enter third grade then they leave us at the end of sixth grade.

I'd like to recognize two people who will be retiring. They have been long time employees and we have been fortunate to have them at EBH as they conclude their careers. Mr. Young is our custodian and his constant positivity has been valued. He responds to classroom needs very quickly and with a smile. Mrs. Garippa has been our teaching assistant was important to all of our work with technology and experiences for Makerspace, LEGOs and chromebooks. Both of them will be missed as we move into next year.

Last year was full of exciting events and fun experiences. We continued to have a large number of clubs/activities for our students and we recognized those on June 14. On May 22, a team of outside observers from Franklin Covey came to "audit" our school and determine if we were meeting the criteria of a Lighthouse School. There is an extensive rubric for this and the areas of academics, environment and leadership are closely examined. The information is then sent to the Franklin Covey organization for a decision. We had parents come on that day to share out experiences, student panels, tours of the building, leadership binders on display, a leadership assembly and an entire day of these observers stopping in classrooms seeing what EBH is all about. This was the culmination of years of work and we were really proud of what we could show off. Then we had to wait to hear the "verdict".....were we there yet??? Waiting is hard!

I am very happy to announce that EBH was given Lighthouse Status! We found out that our school is an exemplar for others and I couldn't be more proud of the students and staff for making this happen. When you look up what it means to be a Lighthouse School, it says that this is like the blackbelt for schools in terms of creating a culture of leadership. It has been fun to see all that has been done and what we are capable of. Being a Lighthouse School is an honor as there are only select schools across the country to earn it.

Congratulations to everyone who is a part of this honor! It took parents being supportive at home, students stepping up to be a voice in our school and faculty and staff being willing to implement practices based on what we learned in our trainings and coaching. 




Hawley's Hike Update




