## Dansville High School - Mustang Athletics Wall of Fame Committee Announces the Induction Class of 2021 (Sponsored by the Dansville Rotary Club)



On December 11, 2021 as part of the Dansville Rotary Boys Basketball Tournament, 3 DHS Alumni were honored as the newest members of the Dansville Athletics Wall of Fame. The ceremony was held between the varsity consolation and championship games. Inductees were introduced to the crowd and walked the length of the court before receiving a members only jacket and a personal frame of their accolades. Inductees proceeded into the Hall of Fame area and hung their personal plaques on the honorary wall.

Chairman of the Athletic Wall of Fame Committee, Dave Moodie, stated: "Dansville Athletics has a proud tradition of talented athletes and coaches, fierce competitors and championship levels of achievement, both individually and as teams.

The members of this year's induction class exemplify the standard of excellence that is required to become a Mustang Wall of Fame Member."

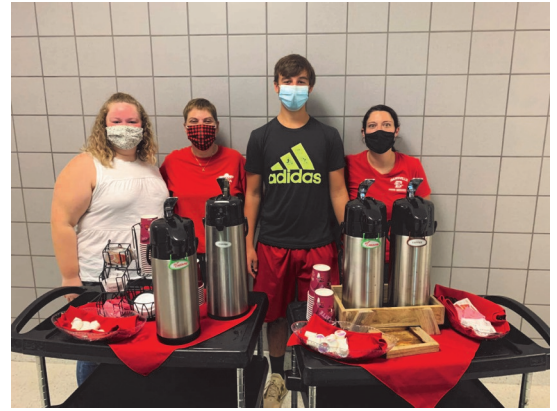
**Tatter Kysor Graduated from DHS in 1998** and was an outstanding wrestler. He finished with a career record of 141 wins and only 45 losses (a school record until 2018). Tatter was a LCAA & Section V Champion in 1997 and 1998. He earned multiple tournament championships, was a 2x recipient of the most outstanding wrestler award and a 3x league all star. The LCAA sportsmanship award is named in his honor. Tatter would like to dedicate earning this award to his brother, Ben Kysor. Tatter states, "without Ben's guidance, none of it would have ever happened."

**Steve Hine Graduated from DHS in 2008.** He was a 3 sport athlete at Dansville High School and competed at the Varsity level for 15 seasons. Steve competed in the New York State Championships in cross country, indoor track and outdoor track. During the 2006 cross country season, Steve earned a 1st place finish at the league championship race, finished in 8th place at the state championship meet, and was selected as 1st team all-state. In 2007, Steve placed 1st at the Section V Class C cross country championship race, finished in 4th place at the state championship meet, qualified for NYS Federation, was selected as 1st team All Greater Rochester, and was the recipient of the Section V Cross Country Sportsmanship Award. In 2008, Steve finished 1st in the 3200 at the outdoor track league championship race, 1st at Sectionals (400, 800, 1600 and 3200), 1st in the steeplechase at the Section V race and 4th in the steeplechase at the state championship meet.

**Nicole Welch graduated from DHS in 2003.** Nicole was a 3 sport athlete. In cross country, she was a 4x Varsity D recipient, 4x sectional qualifier, member of the Section V Class C championship team, and competed at the NYSPHSAA Cross Country State Championships. Nicole swam at the varsity level for 5 years. She was a 5x LCAA all star, selected as the LCAA female MVP, a 5x Section V qualifier, 3x team MVP, 2x captain, and selected as Rookie of the Year. At the time of her graduation, Nicole held all girls' swimming records at DHS except for diving. In outdoor track, Nicole competed at the varsity level for 4 years. During that time, she qualified twice for the meet of champions and was a 4x Section V qualifier. Nicole earned the Dedicated Junior Female Athlete Award and the Most Outstanding Senior Female Athlete Award. She was selected as a national nominee for the Wendy's High School Heisman Award and went on to compete at the collegiate level.

## Letter from Melissa Goho, Primary School Principal

Happy New Year! The excitement was in the air at DPS during the month of December. The four days leading up to Christmas our Student Lighthouse Committee selected theme days for faculty, staff, and students. The theme days included Candy Cane Stripes or Colors Day, Christmas Headwear Day, Merry Christmas Colors Day, and Cozy Pajama Day. There were lots of smiles and Christmas cheer!



The New Year is a time to reflect on our goals and hopes for the upcoming months. Here at DPS we have wildly important goals which connect to the Leader in Me framework. In the fall, the grade level teams selected wildly important goals which are vital to student success in the area of reading. Specifically, the focus in four year old UPK and Kindergarten is letter sounds, in First Grade sight words, and in Second Grade oral reading fluency which is the ability to read connected text quickly, accurately, and with expression. These goals are consistently monitored and teachers are brainstorming and implementing interventions and strategies to support students' growth. At home, you can help our students become better readers by reading to your child or listening to your child read for 15 minutes each day.

This year we started a Student Lighthouse Committee with students from kindergarten to second grade. After an application process, teachers selected a student for the first half of the year to represent their class at these monthly meetings. The Fall 2021 Student Lighthouse Committee includes Ava Coburn (2nd), Blaikley Dixon (1st), Alexandria Fassbender (2nd), Piper Gartz (K), Seeley Gibbs (2nd), Natalie Gray (2nd), Zayden Jeffords (2nd), Arthur Leven (1st), Natalie LeVesque (1st), Stella Mitchell (1st), Easton Murphy (K), Korbyn Smith (1st), Kerri Taylor (K), and Riley Young (K). This group meets one or two times a month with the DPS Faculty Lighthouse team to synergize, including discussing leadership opportunities in our school and ways to make our building even better. Also, they will share updates with their classroom and lead them. Some of their examples of leadership include selecting the theme days for Red Ribbon Week and making signs to hang in the hallways as a reminder, coordinating the Halloween parade sign for their classroom, and being morning hallway greeters. In January, we will start the application process for a new round of Student Lighthouse members.

Hopefully you've had an opportunity to read my weekly newsletter sent out via email as well as available on the website to keep up to date on all the DPS happenings. The newsletter has important information about the upcoming week, a Did You Know section which highlights academics or Leader in Me activities students are engaged in, a Give This a Try section with an idea to engage with your child at home, a weekly question, and information about community events and activities.

I appreciate the warm welcome to Dansville and am enjoying getting to know the students, teachers, staff, and families. By working all together we can help our students do great things now and in the future!

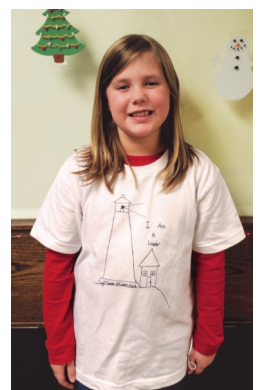

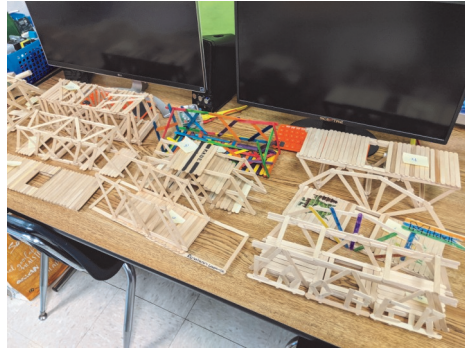
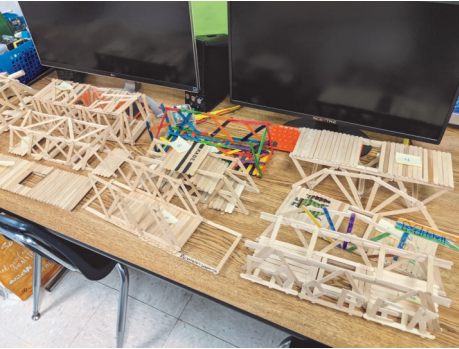

Dansville High School is back in action! The first few months of school have flown by, and in that short period of time so much has been accomplished. Students are engaged in their academics and utilizing 9th period to receive extra support and to participate in various clubs/activities. We have established a winning formula that encourages students to be a part of something and our faculty & staff go above and beyond to do what's best for students. Furthermore, we recognize and celebrate our students' accomplishments.

We have had multiple students selected as **Mustangs of the Month** as a result of their positive attitude and commitment to excellence. Our seniors are being recognized as **Rotary Students of the Month** because of their character and effort to be a model student. Almost 300 students in grades 7-12 have received a **Positive Report Home** for demonstrating their ability to **Learn, Lead, Succeed**.
