

History

Don Bosco Cristo Rey High School and Corporate Work Study Program was founded in 2007 as a member of the Cristo Rey Network (we are 1 of 40 schools in the Network). The Archdiocese of Washington invited the Salesians of Don Bosco of the St. Phillip the Apostle Province of New Rochelle, New York, to co-sponsor and cofound a 'Cristo Rey' model school in the Washington metropolitan area and to imbue the educational approach of St. John Bosco into the new school. The educational vision of the Salesians of Don Bosco inspires all those at Don Bosco Cristo Rey to teach as Jesus taught and to imitate Him in all we say and do. The first Graduation took place on June 2, 2011 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. with 70 graduates who were all accepted to college. Since then, 100% of Don Bosco Cristo Rey graduates have continued to be accepted to college, receiving over \$22 million in merit and need based scholarships in the last two years alone.

Service Learning Hours


All students are required to complete their numbers of hours of service listed below and complete a reflection project based on their service hours experience(s). The number of service hours for each class year are as follows:

Global Seal of Biliteracy

Eighteen students from the Class 2024 were awarded the prestigious Global Seal of Biliteracy upon graduation, an international language certificate that recognizes and celebrates their level of proficiency in two or more languages.

The Global Seal of Biliteracy validates language skills and expands future opportunities for its recipients. It offers three levels of certification: Functional Fluency, Working Fluency, and Professional Fluency, each serving a meaningful purpose in our increasingly diverse and interconnected world. Available in over 100 languages, the Global Seal of Biliteracy has been issued by employers, universities, and secondary schools in over 30 countries and five continents.



College Success & Alumni Persistence (CSAP)

The College Success & Alumni Persistence Center was founded in 2023 and houses several college preparatory programs for current students and alumni to assist them to and through college.

College Prep

Beginning junior year, students are enrolled in a 2-year college prep course that focuses on exposure and guidance to college readiness through precollege program participation, financial aid education, test preparation, and college and scholarship application guidance. Students have been awarded local and national honors such as the following:











Summer Scholars

Established in 2023, the Summer Scholars program is an internal pre-college scholarship opportunity for rising seniors to participate in credit and non-credit summer courses at various colleges and universities. Since Summer of 2023, Summer Scholars have been awarded \$34,517 in scholarship to various pre-college programs across the U.S. including:

- St. John's University National Youth Leadership Forum: Medicine
- University of Rochester Biomedical Engineering
- Catholic University Engineering New Frontiers

SAT Prep

Don Bosco Cristo Rey has focused on strengthening test-taking skills and strategies in preparation for the SAT exam. Students have the opportunity to participate in mock exams, review areas of needed improvement, and participate in one-on-one SAT assistance. As of the Spring 2024 SAT Practice Exam, 88% of students improved their SAT score from their 1st practice exam, resulting in a 30% increase of students scoring above 1,000 on the SAT exam.

Alumni Persistence

Established in 2023, the Alumni Persistence Department specializes in counseling DBCR seniors and alumni that have enrolled, or that would like to enroll, into 2 or 4 year accredited, degree granting colleges or universities. College bound alumni also receive support in financial aid counseling, as well as major, minor/concentration, and course selection.

Parent University

This parent education program was created to equip parents and guardians of DBCR alumni as they navigate from high school to college. Informative workshops and events that focus on financial aid, family and student expectations, understanding student schedules and responsibilities, and how to support full time commuter and on-campus students, are offered twice a year to families of high school seniors, as well as college freshmen and sophomores.

Alumni Persistence Emergency Fund

The Alumni Persistence Emergency Fund (APEF) is a micro-grant fund established in 2024 to assist DBCR alumni in pursuit of their Bachelor's degree with academic-related financial barriers including tuition, room and board, books, and supplies. The first recipients were members of the Class of 2019 through 2024. To date, DBCR alumni have received \$10,000 in APEF micro-grants to continue their education at more than a dozen colleges and universities.

Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP)

Every student gains four years of real-world job experience by working one day a week in a professional setting. This opportunity allows them to earn a portion of their educational costs, explore career options, and manage mature responsibilities—all while keeping tuition low.
