



FAA Part 107 Drone Pilots

In May 2024, Mr. John Robbins and several of his Robotics students started a new challenge, studying to take the Federal Aviation Administration Part 107 Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems licensure. This comprehensive FAA-Certificated Drone Pilot Test covers several aspects of aviation including: application regulations, airspace classification and operating requirements, airport operations, aviation weather sources, maintenance and preflight procedures, and radio communications. The students went to Parr Airport in Zanesville to take the test. The newly licensed FAA Part 107 Drone Pilots are Copper Burnside (junior), Jarrett Paxton (sophomore), Rachel Shook (junior), Hunter Sparks (sophomore), Cas Yawn (sophomore) and Mr. Robbins. The Part 107 licensure is an Industry Credential and is renewed each two years.
