Morgan Local School District Kindergarten Registration for the 2024-25 school year is open. Children must be five years old by August 1, 2024. Registration packets can be found online at morganschools.org or picked up at Morgan Local School District Office located at 65 West Union Avenue, McConnelsville, or in the main office of East Elementary, South Elementary or West Elementary. The deadline for registration is April 22, 2024. Return the Registration Form, Health History Form, Lan-

guage Usage Survey, and Kate Love Simpson Library Card Application, copy of Certified Birth Certificate, Immunization Record, Custody Papers (if applicable), Proof of Residency, and Photo ID (of Parent/Guardian enrolling the student) to the Morgan Local School District Office. Kindergarten Screening appointments will be made by April 22, 2024. Kindergarten Screening date are April 22 and 23, 2024 at West Elementary, April 24 and 25, 2024 at East Elementary and May 7 and 8, 2024 at South Elementary.



Morgan Local School District is accepting applications for preschool for the 2024-25. Applications can be picked up at East Elementary, West Elementary, South Elementary, Morgan Local School District, or Kate Love Simpson Library. The applications are due May 3, 2024. Morgan Local School has two options of

preschool classes in the Elementary buildings. Option #1 is a tuition based program. Students attend preschool four days a week. Students must be four years old by August 1, 2024. Option #2 is a income based program offered at East Elementary and South Elementary. Families must meet the income guidelines to qualify. Students attend preschool two days a week. The Income Based






MORGAN SOUTH


MORGAN WEST




