### 8th Grade visit to Career Technical Education Area at Morgan High School

On March 6, the 8th grade students from Morgan Junior High School went to Morgan High Career Technical Education building for a walk through. At that time, the Junior High students were given presentation from the instructors and students taking the Career Technical Education programs. The programs include Automotive Technology, Cosmetology, Construction Technology, Electronics/Robotics, Health Technology, Precision Machining, and Programming. Each program offers many options for the students.



Automotive Technology prepares student with all ten ASE (Automotive Service Excellence) and OSHA ten hour certification. Test will be given in May and is free to students.

Heath Technology offers junior students 7 college credit hours and seniors 5 college credit hours at Washington State College. Juniors earn OSHA 10 hour safety certification, American Heart Association CPR and First Aid, and State-Tested Nurse Aide. Seniors earn course completion certificate for Phlebotomist and ECG Technician and ability to sit for certification exam for both certifications.



Students learn Virtual Reality, Animation, and Computer Networking in the Programming Pathway.



All Robotics, Electronic, and Computer Hardware students earn OSHA 10 hour safety certification. A/C and Digital Electronics students earn Articulated credit in Engineering at Zane State. Computer Hardware students earn Articulated credit in Engineering at Washington State College and prepares students for TestOut PC Pro, CompTIA 220-1001 (Core 1) and CompTIA 220-1002 (Core 2). Industrial Robotics students earn 8 College Credit Plus credits at Zane State, industry credential from FANUC America Robotics Industry in Handling Tool Operations and Programming and iRVision 2D.



Precision machining students earn OSHA 10 hour safety certification and NIMS (National Institute of Metalworking Skills) Level 1 certification.


