The teams have access to the same types of technologies that students will encounter as they graduate high school and move into the workforce. Mr. Lawson has shared what is happening at MJHS around Ohio and is extremely proud that Morgan Local Schools are exposing students to avenues for future career paths. The Gaming team takes the popular topic of gaming and has students train to compete with other schools. Communication skills and teamwork are key to success. The 3D Printing team has taken designs and made real-world connections with local businesses to apply their skills. Once created, 3D object uses are endless. The Marketing team strives to promote what is happening at school during the day and activities that MJHS students are involved in after school. Yearbook production, athletic programs, social media releases are a few of the tasks these students run. The Robotics team uses various parts to create robot designs to perform tasks. It's like next level Legos. The Drones team trains to navigate through a course using either computer programming or handheld devices. Students fully maintain and repair the drones at MJHS. 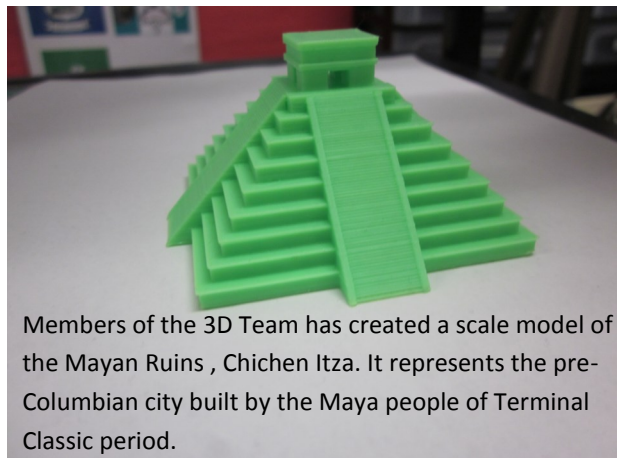

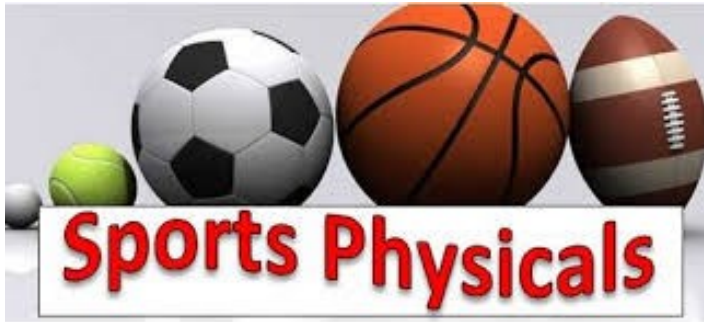

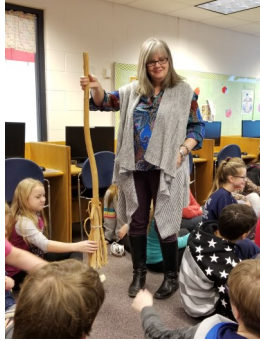
# MORGAN EAST

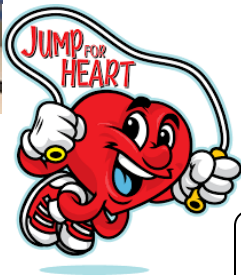

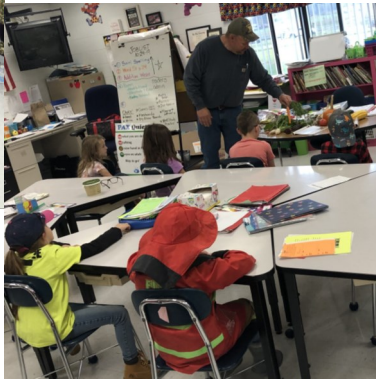

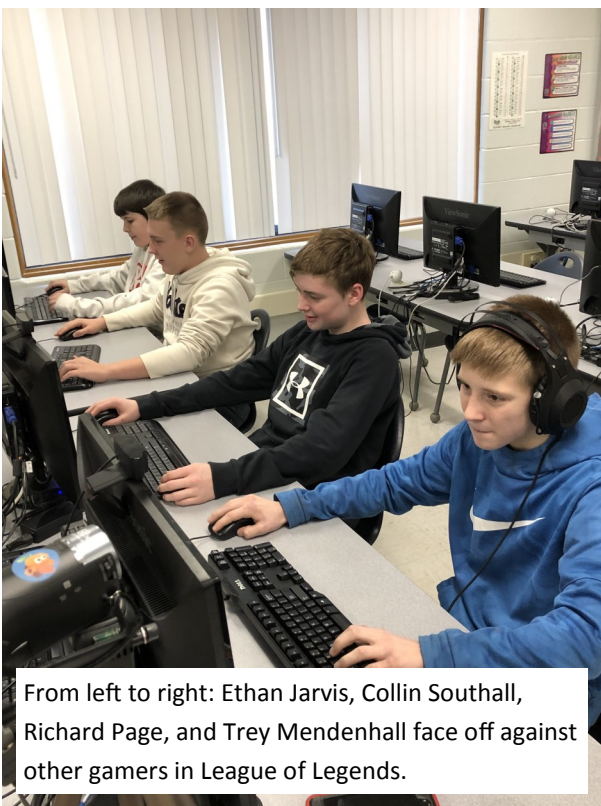
One of the newest programs that we offer is eSports. A combination of video games, strategy, and collaboration, eSports is a competitive gaming league that is growing rapidly in the US and goes from youth leagues all the way up to professional gaming competitions. CNN reports that eSports have “turned casual gamers into serious stars who can sometimes rake in seven-figure earnings and massive brand endorsements.”

There are a number of different games and platforms used in these competitions as well, from Fortnite to Madden NFL, where teams of players face off against each other to take home anything from bragging rights to real cash prizes. Believe it or not, there are even varsity-level collegiate programs, “More than 50 colleges have varsity eSports programs, recognized by a governing body called the National Association of Collegiate Esports. NACE championships dole out thousands of dollars in prize money, which is put towards scholarships for the winners.”

Our BAS teams are co-led by Mike Lawson and Jason Mardis and are comprised of 20 players in total competing in both Rocket League and League of Legends. The primarily 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade squads have already found success in scrimmages against both the high school teams as well as teams from other districts, and they are looking forward to starting competitive play on January 14<sup>th</sup>.

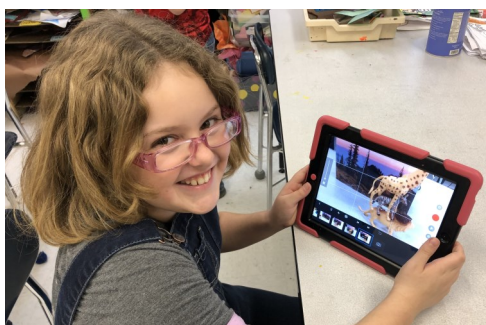

# RAIDER YOUTH ACADEMY EAST

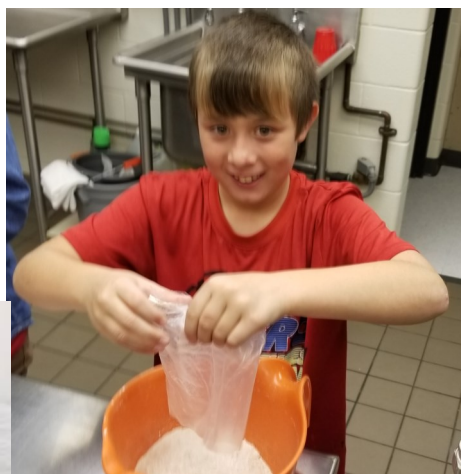
