"Our Freshman Academy aims to help students envision their futures beyond high school. We take the entire freshman class on a college tour, which encourages them to explore opportunities ahead. Additionally, the Freshman Academy Service Initiative inspires students to participate in an Academy-led schoolwide service project, #MyFreedomDay, which raises awareness about the atrocities of human trafficking across the globe. Students can also earn the Freshman Academy distinction of "Freshman 15" by completing 15 hours of volunteer service within the school, through local initiatives, or by attending and supporting school events. This approach encourages students to be actively involved in serving others."
