Complete the packet and contact to Leslie Robbins at (740) 962-1121 to schedule an appointment to return the registration prior to April 22nd, 2024.

Bring the packet and the following information (if you have not already provided it prior to the registration, for example preschool at Morgan Local School District) to the appointment time:

- 1. **Certified** Birth Certificate
- 2. Immunization Record
- 3. Proof of Residency (lease agreement, utility bill, current address of Driver's License)
- 4. Photo ID of the person registering the student
- 5. Custody Documentation, if applicable

You will receive additional information from your student's building staff, once the final plans have been determined (after the first of August).
