Who should apply?

An application is required if:

- Your child is currently enrolled in Osseo Area Schools and requests a different school
- Your child is new to Osseo Area Schools
- You want to enroll your child into a magnet school/program

Applications are typically not required for students who are:

- Continuing at their current school or magnet program to next grade level
- Currently enrolled residents in the Osseo Area Schools district boundaries who are entering sixth grade or ninth grade and are following their school's enrollment pathway

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School bus transportation

Providing safe and reliable transportation so students arrive to school ready to learn and achieve their dreams.

Osseo Area Schools is committed to providing safe and efficient transportation for eligible students. The district offers reliable bus services for those who meet the distance requirements, ensuring students can easily travel to and from school.

Families can access important tools like bus stop locators and realtime tracking apps to stay informed about their child's transportation. Below are key points about the transportation services available for Osseo Area Schools students.

- **Eligibility:** Students are eligible for bus transportation if they live 0.8 mile or more from school (elementary) or live one mile or more from school (middle and high school) from their attendance area. Families can use the "Find My School" tool to determine school assignment and transportation options.
- **Bus stops:** Specific pickup and drop-off times can be found using tools provided by the district, such as ParentVUE and the FirstView bus tracking app.
- **Bus tracking:** The FirstView app helps families monitor bus locations in real-time, which can ease concerns about bus schedules and ensure better communication during delays.

With clear eligibility guidelines and easy-to-use tools for tracking bus routes, families can navigate transportation smoothly. Whether determining eligibility or monitoring your child's bus, Osseo Area Schools ensures a simple and efficient process for all.

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE)

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) helps set the foundation for a lifetime of learning. Most classes include time for children and families to grow and learn together, as well as time for children to engage in independent learning while parents/caregivers explore insights and resources from licensed educators.

Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE)

Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) provides opportunities for growth and support of children and their families. Children from birth to age five who meet eligibility criteria can receive special education services.

Preschool, PreK, Half-Day, Every Day Prekindergarten and Four Star Express

Osseo Area Schools offers fee-based preschool and both tuition-free and fee-based prekindergarten programs for children ages three to five. These early learning opportunities help students build a strong foundation for lifelong learning.

Early Childhood Screening

Early Childhood Screening is a free service for children ages three to five. It assesses development in areas like vision, hearing, communication, motor skills and social-emotional growth, helping to identify any needs early in their educational journey. This important step prepares children for a successful start in kindergarten.

Early Childhood and Family Education (EC&FE)

The EC&FE program offers ECFE classes, ECFE Visits, Preschool and PreK classes, Early Childhood Screening and community resources to help parents and children (birth to five) build a strong foundation for lifelong learning.

Four Star Express

Four Star Express is a prekindergarten plus care program for children four or five-yearsold on or before Sept. 1. The program is offered during the school year and on most non-school days.

Kidstop

Kidstop is choice-based school-age care program for students in kindergarten through fifth grade. The program is offered before school, after school and most non-school days.

Youth Enrichment

Youth Enrichment classes engage students after school, in the evenings, weekends and summertime. Classes for elementary and middle school students may include art, chess, STEM, languages, music lessons, robotics, sports, theater and more.

Adult Enrichment

Adult Enrichment provides a variety of unique classes for adults with an accessible way to get inspired, try new things and engage with others in the community.

Ready to enroll?

Important information for enrolling in Osseo Area Schools

Determine eligibility

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First, ensure your child meets the age requirements. Children entering kindergarten must be at least five years old by Sept. 1 of the enrollment year.

Find your school

Use the district's school finder tool, district279.org/find-my-school to determine which school serves your home address or choose one of the district's magnet schools or online school, 279Online.

Submit an enrollment form

Complete the enrollment packet available at district279.org/enroll. You can also fill out a paper form and submit it to the Enrollment Center, if preferred.

Provide required documents

Submit proof of your child's age (birth certificate or passport), immunization records, and proof of residency (such as a utility bill or lease agreement).

Magnet schools

If you're interested in enrolling your child in a magnet school or program, please apply first through the Northwest Suburban Integration School District at **nws.k12.mn.us**. Upon approval, you'll receive instructions on completing the enrollment process.

Visit the Enrollment Center

If you have questions or need assistance, the district's Enrollment Center is available to help. They can guide you through the process or answer any questions or concerns.

School assignment

Once your child's application and documents are processed, the district will confirm your child's assigned school. If you've applied for a magnet program, you'll receive additional notification regarding acceptance.

Important information for Magnet schools

- Online application: Complete and submit an online application through Northwest Suburban Integration School District's website, nws.kl2.mn.us. The application portal opens in mid-October.
- **Priority application period:** The priority application period extends from mid-Oct. through Dec. 31.
- Lottery process: For more information about the lottery process, visit nws.kl2.mn.us.
- Second chance: The application portal reopens in Jan., with a second lottery held in March.
- **Sibling priority:** If your child has a sibling attending the magnet school of your choice during the same school year, an application must be submitted by the priority deadline to increase their chances of securing a seat.
- **Transportation:** Free transportation is available to and from all magnet schools if you live within the school districts of Anoka-Hennepin, Brooklyn Center, Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose, ISD728 (Elk River-Otsego-Rogers-Zimmerman), Fridley, Osseo or Rockford.
