There wasn't a whole lot of drama in the Crockett County gymnasium Monday night when Jackson North Side came to Alamo for a basketball doubleheader.

Both games were certified routs. In the opener, Crockett's undefeated Lady Cavaliers absolutely destroyed the Lady Indians 61-12, scoring 31 consecutive points in one stretch. In the nightcap, North Side's talented run-and-gun squad raced to a lopsided 85-48 triumph, improving its record to 8-1.

Coach Kayla Irvin's girls – now 7-0 – received points from 12 different players. Crockett enjoyed an 8-3 lead when point guard Gabby Bursey drilled a three-pointer that ignited the incredible run of 31 straight tallies, carrying all the way into the start of the third quarter when Karlee Castellaw began the second half with three consecutive treys and sent the starters to the bench for the night.

Those five had already sat much of the first half, as Irvin and assistant coach Brent Fronabarger substituted liberally throughout the contest. Still, Crockett roared to a 33-3 halftime advantage. When Castellaw's 90-second, ninepoint barrage made it 42-3 in the third period, it was reserves the rest of the way. Castellaw netted 11 points overall to pace the offense, followed by Amaria Walker with 10, Bursey and Jordyn Maddox with seven apiece, and four players – Torey Savage, Ellie Henderson, Wesley Thornton, and Kira Bray – each adding four.

In the boys contest, Crockett put up a decent fight in the opening quarter. A DK Woods bucket had the hosts within 8-6 at the 4:29 mark, and five points by Reed Leforgee kept it close at 19-14 with seven seconds remaining. But Javonte Smith quickly drove the length of the floor for an acrobatic layup which beat the buzzer for a 21-14 margin, and the floodgates were opened.

Working an offense that would drive the ball into the lane and then kick it back out to the corners, wings, or top of the key, the Indians knocked down 11 treys during the night and played at a pace which would tire an NBA team. Coach Rick Rudesill's charges gave their usual effort, but North Side's speed and athleticism was on full display as 12 different players reached the scoring column.

The visitors led 41-24 at the break and then packed an amazing 32 points into the third quarter alone, nailing five of their threes. Lincoln Woods was North Side's top scorer for the contest with 19, ably supported by Desmond Manley's 17 points and three other Indians with nine apiece.

Cade Freeman was Crockett's lone double-figure scorer with 19. Woods and Leforgee contributed five each and Kevin Pledge and Preston Lambert managed four apiece. The Cavs fell to 2-5 on the season.

Both Crockett teams travel to Haywood Tuesday night (tonight) for a 6:00 doubleheader.
