Key insights gathered from staff the November 1st Professional Development Day evaluations:

Positives:

- Overall, participants had a very positive experience, with 80% rating it a 4 or 5 out of 5.
- Popular sessions included breathwork, massage, Kami, Canva, restorative practices, and ELL/LGBTQ+ strategies.
- Participants appreciated the variety of offerings and opportunities for self-care, collaboration, and learning new tools/techniques.
- Many commented on the fun, relaxed atmosphere and enjoyed things like karaoke, Legos, and game shows.

Suggested Improvements:

- Some participants would have liked more unstructured work time or dedicated "brain break" periods.
- A few requested more sessions on student mental health, drug/substance abuse, and trauma-informed practices.
- There were requests for a full-day restorative practices training and more ongoing self-care workshops.

Requested Future Sessions:

- Massage therapy, breathwork, and other wellness/stress management offerings.
- Further training on ELL modifications, LGBTQ+ student support, and restorative practices
- More hands-on technology sessions like Kami, Canva, and Ozobots
- Opportunities to collaborate, network, and learn from colleagues.

Based on the feedback, here are the specific classes that participants indicated they would like to see offered again:

- Breathwork/meditation
- Massage therapy
- Kami (for creating digital assignments/assessments)
- Canva (for creating visual content)
- Restorative practices training
- Sessions focused on ELL strategies and supporting LGBTQ+ students.
- Hands-on technology workshops (e.g. Ozobots, Book Creator)
- Opportunities for cross-school collaboration and networking
- Sessions on student mental health, drug/substance abuse, and trauma-informed teaching
- Additional self-care and wellness workshops (e.g. Orange Theory, yoga, crochet)

In summary, the conference was very well received, with participants appreciating the focus on self-care, new instructional strategies, and cross-school community building. The feedback indicates strong interest in continuing to build on these types of offerings in the future.

<p>Data Collection and Implementation to Drive Curriculum and Instruction</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• On November 1st at our Superintendent Conference Day, all 2nd and 3rd grade teachers collaborated to review Math data from the NYS Grade 3 Math Exam in 2024. Teachers reviewed the questions, answers and data that was collected and discussed ways to create cross-grade-level consistency to improve student proficiency on the exam.• We are pleased to share the improved progress of our K-2 data collection among teachers using Foundations unit assessments for phonics and Eureka unit assessments for math. These tools provide valuable insights into student progress, allowing us to adjust instruction and offer targeted support where needed. This data-driven approach helps improve outcomes in both literacy and math. We will be assessing all students in December to monitor student growth.

Curriculum and Instruction	<p>ELA- All grade levels are currently in their informational reading unit. Students are engaged with text sets to gain background knowledge about a specific topic. This reading experience will lead to their next writing unit where students will research a specific area of their topic and create a research paper/project.</p> <p>Math- Math classes are continuing to implement new inquiry-based approaches to teaching math. Some of the current strategies being used are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Standing white boards- students work as a group around a standing white board in order to use problem solving skills to work through math problems.2. Three Reads- teachers walk students through high level word problems using the three reads process. This allows students to determine what the important information is, what the question is actually asking and finally, what they need to do in order to solve the problem. <p>Science- Middle school science classes are actively engaging students in hands-on, inquiry-based lessons to foster curiosity and deepen understanding of scientific concepts.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. In one engineering and design project, students are constructing spaghetti structures that must be strong yet lightweight, with the final day of building culminating in testing their durability through controlled crushing.2. As part of a Plate Tectonics lesson, students are conducting a weathering lab, using tools to simulate erosion on cookies and analyzing which tools cause the most significant effects.3. Another set of lessons introduces students to light through exploration labs with prisms, magnifying glasses, and mirrors, helping them observe and describe phenomena like reflection, refraction, and rainbow formation in everyday terms. Across all lessons, students actively engage in scientific practices, develop vocabulary through experience, and apply their learning in meaningful, real-world contexts.
Data Collection	November benchmarks were administered in all content areas.
