# **Testing Information - ACT and SAT**

Second semester of junior year is when students usually take the ACT and/or SAT for the first time.

As was announced in the December 5th newsletter, the juniors will be taking a practice ACT on Wednesday January 15th. Later in January, Analyze Ed will provide each junior with an individualized report on what areas to focus on to prepare for the School Day ACT that they will take on Tuesday April 8th. More details about the report from Analyze Ed and the School Day ACT will be provided after we return from Christmas.

Juniors should not register to take the ACT on Saturday April 5th. If they choose to retake the ACT later in June or July (dates are below on the right) or in the 1st semester of senior year, they will register at MyACT.org.

The SAT is now Digital! As of March 2024, there is no longer a paper and pencil test for the SAT - it may only be taken as a digital test. For more information about the Digital SAT, click <u>here</u> to go to the <u>College Board website</u>.

As you and your junior discuss whether they will take the SAT, or if they will retake the ACT, or if they should do test prep, we suggest reading this blog post:

While the blog is from October 2021 when the impact of COVID on testing was still very new, the topics it covers are still ones to discuss now in 2024. The writers states:

"I want parents to come away with the tools to make the 3 binary testing decisions on the road to college application:

- 1. to prep for tests or not to prep
- 2. to test or not to test
- 3. to submit scores or not to submit"

# **ACT / SAT Test Prep Opportunities**

ACT Test Prep Class - Watch for information in January about an in-person ACT test prep class to be taught here at Marian. Details are being finalized and information will be available after we return from Christmas Break.

If you / your junior are considering ACT test prep for the April ACT and are not interested in the class that will be held at Marian, you should start looking now. Test prep classes in advance of the April ACT will begin in late January or early February.

**Analyze Ed -** As mentioned above, juniors will take a full-length practice ACT on Wednesday January 15th. After the test, every junior who takes the test will receive an individualized program to assist them in preparing for the ACT in April. More information will be given to the juniors in mid to late January about this program.

# **Test Optional update**

The number of colleges and universities that are test optional for the Class of 2025 is over 1,700. Who will be test optional for the Class of 2026 is still to be determined. In 2020 due to COVID, many colleges and universities decided to become test optional permanently. Others announced that they would be test optional through the Class of 2025 while they conducted a pilot study to look at the effect / impact of not requiring test scores for admission. Some colleges and universities may announce in the upcoming months that they will return to requiring a test score for students in the Class of 2026. Be sure to check with any college or university that your student is considering applying to to find out if they will continue to be test optional.

Another excellent source for a directory of test optional schools is Fair Test. They regularly update their directory of test-optional, 4-year schools. It is available free online at <a href="https://www.fairtest.org/university/optional">https://www.fairtest.org/university/optional</a> -- sort geographically by clicking on "State".

Even with the number of schools that are test optional, we recommend that juniors have at least one test score on hand, either from the ACT or SAT. Test scores may be required for some majors and scholarships. Another factor is that having a strong test score may also strengthen a student's application. This is one reason that we are offering the School Day ACT so that students will have a score available should they need it next year.

If a student applies to a school that is not test optional and does require a test score, scores from either the ACT or SAT may be submitted.

# What to do 2nd semester to get ready for next year

When we met with the students at the start of this year, we asked them to consider two questions - "Why do I want to go to college?" and "What do I want to do in college?" instead of focusing on "Where do I want to go to college?". The following are some of the activities that the college counselors will be doing with the juniors in second semester to assist them in getting ready for next year.
