STARTING IN THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR, THE POLICY WILL REDUCE THE NUMBER OF ALLOWABLE ABSENCES PER SEMESTER FOR STUDENTS FROM TEN (10) TO EIGHT (8).




**Bell Schedules** 

- Students who exceed 8 absences in a semester shall receive a NC for that class, unless they have failed the class and then they will receive an F.
- If a student exceeds 8 absences, a doctor's statement that confirms
  the dates of the illness may be turned in to the attendance office
  upon the student's return to school resulting in the absence(s) being
  changed to an excused absence(s). Doctors' notes should be
  submitted to building administrative assistants upon return from
  absence(s). Original doctor's notes or other documentation should be
  kept for your own records.
- Students who fail based only on their attendance exceeding the 8-day limit may submit an appeal to a site committee within five (5) days prior to the end of the current semester. The appeal form is located on the school website. Instructions for the process of submitting the form to the Appeal Committee is located on the form. The appeal committee consisting of an administrator and counselor will review the merits of the appeal and submit a final decision to the site administrator. The decision of the committee is final.



## Eagle project to add 40-foot flagpole to Lions Club property

Flags will soon be able to fly high around the Mustang Lions Club property on Frisco Road.

That comes thanks to the efforts of one aspiring eagle scout and the eight-to-10 scouts from Troop 396 located out of Mustang. Troop 396 has had a working relationship with the Mustang Lions Club, with

a previous scouts' project adding benches, and that work helped in adding a flagpole to the list of partnerships with the troop and club.

Monte McLeod, who decided on the flagpole as his Eagle Scout project, said the club was in need of a new flagpole and that conversations with Lions Club President Rob Estes helped identify that as need with the goal to recognize veterans and

bring attention to the Lions Club.

"I didn't quite understand how to do all of this stuff, but with the help of my peers I got there," McLeod said. "I definitely understand a lot more of what I am doing now."

The flagpole will stand 40 feet tall. McLeod said he was still working out the exact amounts of different

This month was the last robotics meet of the semester for MHS teams competing in FIRST Tech Challenge robotics competitions. Two of our student teams (Radical Robotics and Knightmares) worked together to post the highest score in the state of Oklahoma so far this season. Both of these teams are internationally ranked. Out of approximately 6000 FTC teams around the world, Knightmares is currently ranked 30th! Radical Robotics isn't far behind at 389th. (For reference, 87,400+ students in Grades 7-12 competed on FIRST® Tech Challenge teams in 67 countries in 2022-2023, and it has grown since then.)
