Vocabulary Lesson Plan



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Overview

Students will develop a working knowledge of the vocabulary they will encounter throughout the CyberSmarts: Staying Safe Online series.

Time

This activity can be completed in five forty-minute class periods.

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INSTRUCTION AND ACTIVITIES

Activating Strategy: All students will participate when asked if they have ever used a form of the vocabulary organizer before. All students will participate for a second time when asked if they have ever used one of the suggested Web sites or the electronic databases to be demonstrated. A brief whole class demonstration following will serve to activate student prior knowledge of the organizer and resources to be used.

Teaching Tip: Distribute the CyberSmarts: Staying Safe Online Vocabulary Pretest to gauge students' prior knowledge.

Teaching Strategy: The teacher will divide the class into collaborative pairs, then divide the collaborative pairs into 6 groups giving each group's students a different Vocabulary Organizer to work from. Using the suggested Web resources, students within each group will independently fill out their organizers. After completing the Vocabulary Organizer students will compare recorded definitions and meaningful sentences with their partners. When collaborative pairs are satisfied with both sides of their organizer, the group will come together to decide who wants to teach the class which word(s) making sure all words for that group get taught by someone. Each student will star the word he/she is responsible for teaching. He/she is responsible for putting this same word, definition, picture, and sentence on the classroom poster Vocabulary Organizer.

Summarizing Strategy: Using markers, students will record their picture/word/definition/sentence on the classroom Vocabulary Organizer poster board laid out in the classroom or media center. When the posters are complete they will hang in the classroom for quick student reference for the remainder of the semester.

Teaching Tip: If class time is limited, you can omit the classroom poster portion of the activity and move to students sharing their definitions with the class.

Each student will be responsible for teaching his/her starred word to the rest of the class using the document camera/LCD projector. In this manner each student will summarize his/her learning through teaching his/her assigned word to the class. The rest of the class will be learning through listening and recording the definitions taught on the Vocabulary Definitions worksheet. Students are exposed to/ taught 30 words but have only independently researched 5 vocabulary words.

ASSESSMENT

Teacher observation of student participation as well as correctly completed vocabulary organizer(s) and definitions worksheet, classroom posters, and student accuracy and preparedness to teach the starred vocabulary word.
