Science: This week students will present their partner projects. Their posters will detail the structures and functions of some amazing animals!

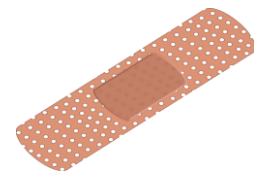
Poetry: Formal recitations of "The Rhinoceros" by Ogden Nash will take place on Thursday, 12/19.
