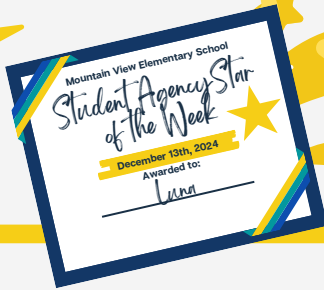

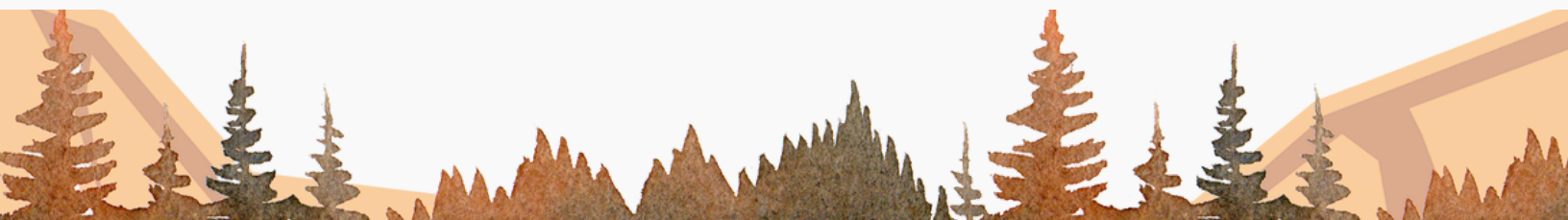
Jennifer Johnson
