Review of Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (Required review every 6 months of ESSER III Grant Funds)

Instructional Delivery & Exposure to Core Content

Williamston Community Schools will solely provide in-person instruction to our student population for the 2022-23 school year.

Students will receive standards-aligned instruction in all core content areas and will also receive instruction in elective and/or ARC classes. Schedules also include opportunities for tiered support (MTSS) for academic and social-emotional needs.

All district curriculum is aligned with the State of Michigan Standards and is appropriately paced to support learning.

Assessment and Grading

Our district assessment system is based on the Michigan Standards. Daily formative assessment is a key component that supports feedback to learners and also guides and informs each teacher's instruction. District developed and/or core program summative assessments are administered at the end of a period of learning such as at the completion of a unit of study. This allows us to monitor student learning, skill acquisition, and academic performance. Additionally, WCS consistently monitors student progress through assessments such as NWEA MAP and Aimsweb+.

Our grading system remains the same during periods of virtual instruction and in-person instruction. Progress reports are sent home to families at the end of each marking period. In addition, PowerSchool, emails, phone calls, and other communications are used to share information and to address celebrations as well as concerns.

Face Covering Protocols

Williamston Community Schools do not require face coverings at this time. Students and staff may wear face coverings if so desired.

Cleaning Protocols

Williamston Community Schools ensures high-level disinfection practices in all district building.

Athletics

Williamston Community Schools aligns all athletic programs and protocols to the approved Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) guidelines.

Screening Protocols

Parents/guardians should conduct a daily student wellness check prior to sending students to school. Parents should not send students to school if they are sick.

COVID-19 Testing & Quarantining Protocols

Student and staff vaccinations are not required. Through grant funds, Williamston will continue to employ one health resource advocate to assist with covid-19 testing should staff or families request a rapid test be performed. For 2022-23, Williamston Community Schools will not be conducting contract tracing nor imposing quarantine rules.
