# THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

## Rejoice

“The LORD, your God, is in your midst,  
a mighty savior;  
he will rejoice over you with gladness,  
and renew you in his love,  
he will sing joyfully because of you.”

Zephaniah 3:17

The third Sunday of Advent in Year C, known as Gaudete Sunday, is a day of “rejoicing” or celebrating. The Scripture readings invite us to experience joy and anticipation for the arrival of the Lord. They emphasize the happiness found in eagerly awaiting Jesus' coming. In the book of Zephaniah, we are called to rejoice and be glad with all our hearts. Zephaniah reassures us that God is near, and His presence will bring us peace and security.

# GREGORIAN CHANTS

## DURING ADVENT

Advent is a liturgical season that marks the beginning of the ecclesiastical year in the Catholic Church. It is characterized by spiritual preparation for the coming of Christ, both in His Nativity and His glorious second coming. It is a period of reflection, hope, and expectation. A Gregorian chant is the official liturgical chant of the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, developed primarily between the 9th and 10th centuries. It is monophonic (a single melody) and unaccompanied by instruments, which gives it an austere and contemplative character. Its origin is attributed to Pope Gregory the Great, who reorganized the Roman liturgy and promoted this style of music.

In this context, Gregorian chants, with their spirituality, simplicity, and theological depth, are especially appropriate for liturgical celebrations during Advent. The chants help to enhance prayer and meditation, convey solemnity: and introspection, and they foster Church unity and faith.

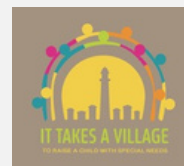
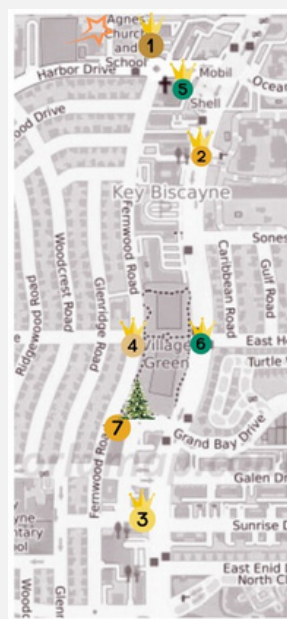

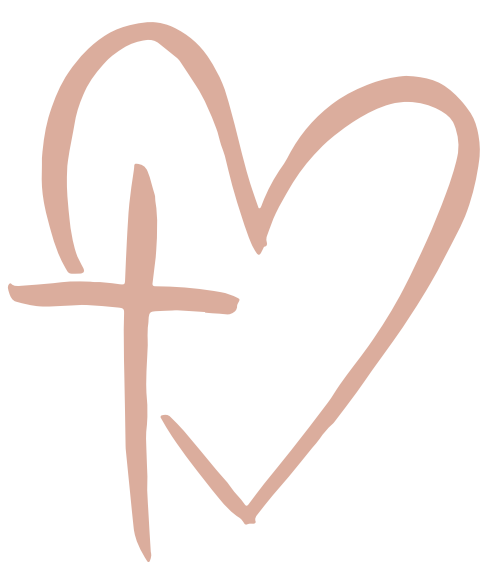

A \$350 non-refundable per person deposit is required at booking time, together with the registration form & a copy of the passport. A valid American passport (valid at least 6 months after the return date) is necessary to travel.
