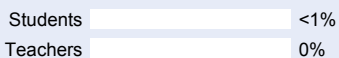

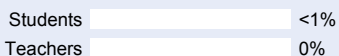

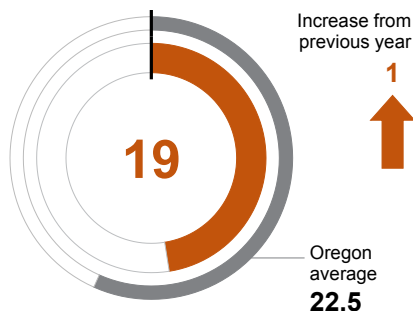

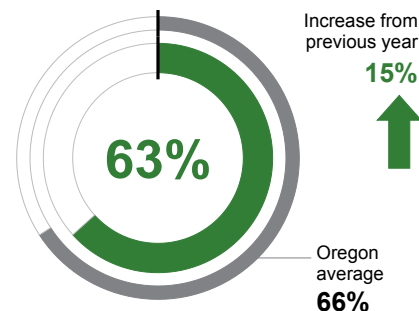
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

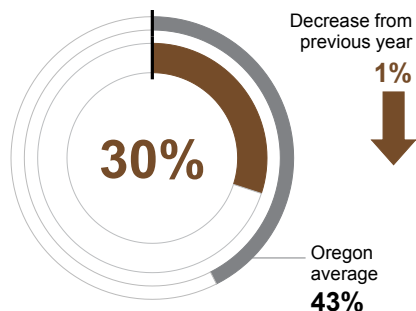

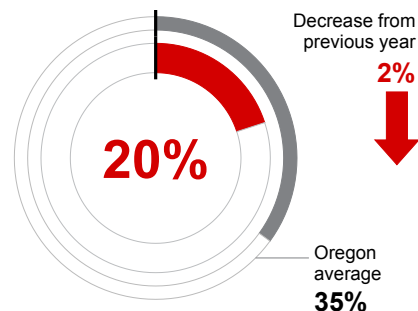
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



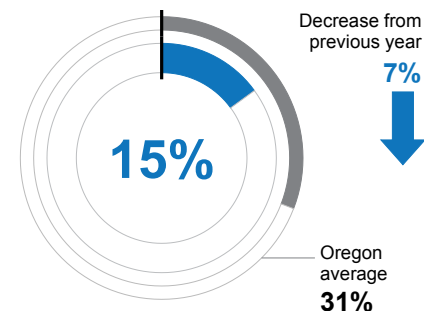
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

The safety of our students is always our number one priority. Educators teach lessons in all grades on tolerance, conflict resolution, and self-regulation. Our Student Support Liaison provides support with emotional and behavioral needs for all students. We follow our policies and procedures to keep all students safe from bullying, intimidation, harassment, cyber bullying, and threats of violence. We take reports of bullying or harassment seriously and work with students and their families when reported. When situations do arise, we utilize Restorative Justice Practices as much as possible to restore relationships and make sure that students who experience harm have an active role in the resolution.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our school year at RRES is filled with opportunities for students to participate beyond the classroom. These include: educational field trips, working in our school garden, educational family nights, a talent show, Bubble Run, as well as many engaging activities for students to participate in while at recess. Through the work of staff and parent volunteers, students are provided a variety of ways to develop their academic, social, and leadership skills both inside and out of the classroom.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Rogue River Elementary School is continually working towards increasing family and community engagement. We have a team consisting of staff and families that focus on how we can create a more welcoming environment for all those who enter our building. Parents are encouraged to volunteer within classrooms, participate in our Family Committee, and volunteer at school wide events. As a school, we are working to reimagine our family conferences where we will be able to work with families on how we can all support our students academically and with their social emotional learning.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Rogue River Elementary School recognizes that community partners are essential to supporting our students.
